was proud to announce in February that the council had bought a site to locate and build a new special needs school. Getting a new special needs school in the borough is something the council has been trying to achieve for many years.

Since then, alongside the Children's Services Cabinet Member, Cllr Hitesh Karia, and officers, I have worked hard to get funding from the Department for Education for it to go ahead. I'm now really pleased to say that in April we received the news that we had secured the funding from the government to provide the new school, which will offer 292 places for pupils with severe learning disabilities and autism aged from four to 19 years of age.

I am delighted that that we have managed to secure the land and funding and for this new school to be built. It's an exciting prospect that has the potential to shape many young lives. There's more information about the project inside. We also speak to the Headteacher of Alexandra School, which is expanding to offer 30 more places to primary-aged pupils with learning difficulties. These are both positive developments that will help us to meet the needs of our young people and assist them to achieve their full potential.

In this magazine we also update you on some key projects which are really important to me including the enhancement of the town centre and our ongoing work to make our streets cleaner and safer. There's also an update on the project to reopen the leisure centre pool. We also meet Robyn Hearts, a local musician who came to wider prominence recently following a viral social media post. Robyn is a licensed busker whose wonderful harp playing also offers enhancements to the town centre.


The affordable housing scheme will support residents to live independent and healthy lives and feel more integrated into the local community.

Support to stay safe and get scam smart

Research by Age UK suggests up to a fifth of over 50s fear answering their phone or opening the door because of the risk of scams.

The charity is on a mission to improve confidence and help us all to better protect ourselves. Here are a couple of things to watch out for – a cold-caller who raises a scary



and expensive problem, like a roofing issue; or who pressurises you into a decision or a payment.

In situations like these, always seek a second opinion from someone you trust and never make a decision on the spot. Anyone wanting access to your property should also raise alarm bells. Whatever the circumstances, always ask to see ID – legitimate callers will be happy to provide. It's OK to reject, refuse or ignore any requests – only scammers will try to rush or panic you.




Your unwanted clothes collected for free

Each year we find a large amount of textiles in household waste bins that we're unable to recycle. Our recycling officers are on a mission to tackle that unnecessary waste and encourage local people to recycle and reuse.

Through our partnership with TRAID a charity working to reuse and donate clothes, we've seen the amount of textiles incorrectly placed in bins falling dramatically as TRAID household collections rise.

Thousands of items of clothing in good wearable condition are collected by TRAID and resold. The funds raised go to projects that improve conditions and working practices in the textile industry. How would you be affected by changes to Council Tax Support?

Tell us before 27 October – consultation now open

he council is considering changing the amount of Council Tax Support that some people get towards their bill. We want your views on the proposed changes and any impact they would have on your household.

We're looking at this only because the amount of money the council is spending on Council Tax Support is rising significantly – by £5 million in the last 9 years. Across all of its services, the council needs to save more than £15 million over the next three years – it's a challenge that many other councils are facing. The council needs to take action so it can continue to provide services that people rely on.

We want to make sure that Council Tax Support continues to be available to support our most vulnerable residents, including people with disabilities, now and in the future. We believe the fairest way to do that is to protect these people and pensioner households and ask others to contribute more.



Pensioner households could still get help to cover all of their Council Tax bill.

Households classed as vulnerable could

still get help to cover 86 percent of their



All other households

The amount of Council Tax Support all other households get would go down – they could get help to cover half of their bill, down from a maximum of 70 percent currently.



All other households in higher band properties These households in properties rated Bands E to H for Council Tax would be treated as if they lived in a Band D property. This means they would pay more Council Tax.



All households with other adults

In about 700 households there are one or more independent adults. They live with the person that gets Council Tax Support and their partner, if they have one, but don't rely on them for support. We already expect them to contribute towards the household's Council Tax bill. Under the changes, we'd ask these people to make a bigger contribution.

What help would be available?

We're looking at ways to help the people that would be most affected if these changes were introduced, including by offering a hardship fund. The survey asks for other ideas to manage any impact.

What happens next?

You have until 27 October to fill in our survey.

No decision has been made to make any of these changes – we'll look very carefully at the survey results before we make any decision to change Council Tax Support. Your views are essential and we'll keep you updated throughout.

"Harrow is definitely the friendliest town I've busked in" - Harpist Robyn Hearts

Berforming in Harrow town centre for more than five years. In that time she has built quite a fanbase – and gained a little notoriety.

Robyn, who says she was always "mesmerised" by the instrument, was given a second-hand Celtic harp for her 17th birthday.

She decided to busk as a way of earning some pocket money while studying for her Bachelors degree in bass guitar.

Since then she has become a regular sight in Harrow town centre, building up a local fanbase with thousands of followers on social media.

Associated with ancient civilisation and classical music, Robyn admits her current inspiration has a more modern source. "My favourite song to play has to be anything from the Legend of Zelda franchise. I'm a huge fan of game music," she says.

Robyn already had a large local following but went viral on social media earlier this year after she was filmed being challenged by a member of the public threatening to report her for begging.

Happily, Robyn had full permission from the council to perform, and is seen calmly continuing to play her soothing music during the confrontation.

Robyn says: "The people of Harrow have shown nothing but support and positivity to my busking. Harrow is definitely the friendliest town I've busked in.

"It's very rare that I encounter a 'Karen', which is probably why I could act so calm!"

Busking is a great way to gain valuable exposure as a blooming artist. Harrow has two designated pitches for licensed buskers. Anyone performing in a non-designated area will be asked to move and may be fined.

nity and diversity is the theme for the Harrow's first Bangladeshi Mayor, Cllr Salim Chowdhury.

Harrow's 72nd Mayor will be raising funds for his chosen charity, London Community Kitchen – which helps residents struggling with food poverty.

Away from council business, Cllr Chowdhury's passion is food and he owns two restaurants in the borough.

"It's a privilege and honour to be appointed as the new Mayor of Harrow – and the first British-Bengali mayor," he said.

"As such, I'm reminded of just how diverse our borough is and why we should always celebrate this. I am looking forward to meeting people and community groups – it is these people that make Harrow so special.

"I would like to thank the outgoing mayor who I have been supporting this last year as deputy. I will continue both his and the legacy of previous mayors to bring people together. "While I look forward to starting my Mayoral year, I encourage everyone to support my charity, London Community Kitchen who do incredible things to help those most in need.

"Finally, I would also like to thank everyone who has supported me and my family over the years and given their trust in me to take on this role."

Cllr Chowdhury has lived in Harrow since the age of 17, becoming a councillor in 2006, and again in 2022, representing Pinner South and Centenary wards.

Education

Hundreds of extra special school places on the way

ith around 2,400 children with education, health and care plans in Harrow, meeting demand for school places is a challenge.

Significant work is underway to meet growing need, including a new special school at 265 The Ridgeway.

The council has also approved plans for 30 extra places at Alexandra School, which teaches children aged 4-11 with moderate learning difficulties.

Perdy Buchanan-Barrow, coheadteacher at Alexandra School, says: "We're really pleased the council is partnering with us on this. We want to meet the needs of Harrow pupils first and foremost. So, being able to support more children is great."



The expansion would see the school site and buildings redeveloped, the introduction of a new food technology room and more facilities for targeted curriculum work. The improvements will also give every classroom direct access to outdoor space.

Ms Buchanan-Barrow says they're not underestimating the change ahead.



"It will be a challenge but I know the team are up for it," she says.

"We will need to recruit new teachers and Learning Support Assistants (LSAs) and that presents its own challenges but we're good at training our own. We have a learning support assistant who's just done the apprenticeship route to become a teacher this year and another one who will do it next year.

"Our priority is making sure we continue to meet the needs of our existing pupils and the needs of our new pupils as they join us at Alexandra."

Meanwhile, the new school at The Ridgeway will bring an extra 292 school places for local children with complex needs. This will bring significant benefits to families in Harrow and the council – reducing the costs associated with travel and outer borough school placement.

This will be Harrow's first special school for 20 years.

nother successful day of action saw teams from the council, the police and other partners join Harrow Business Improvement District to tackle anti-social behaviour and safety issues in Harrow town centre.

Two arrests were made, with stop and searches and parking checks also carried out. There were also business compliance checks, as well as littering and fly-tipping investigations.

Since April, we've held four targeted days of action, working with the police to address local issues and ensuring residents and communities feel safe – part of our commitment to restore pride in Harrow.

We've shared safety advice and information as well as tackling anti-social behaviour and fly-tipping, helped homeless people, and carried out weapon sweeps and blue badge checks at events in South Harrow, Edgware and Sudbury Hill.
