2011 CENSUS POPULATION ESTIMATES AT SUB-BOROUGH LEVEL AND DATA ON SECOND HOMES

On 23rd November the Office for National Statistics released 2011 Census population and household estimates at sub-borough level. Geographies included were: Ward, Middle Layer Super Output Area (MSOA), Lower Layer Super Output Area (LSOA) and Output Area (OA). On 22nd October the Office for National Statistics (ONS) released data on Second Homes for local authorities in England and Wales.

This paper highlights some of the key results based on: Harrow's resident population; population density; people living in communal establishments; households; and changes in age structure, all at ward and LSOA level. In addition, some key facts on the number of people with second addresses are also included in this paper.

Ward level data is shown in Appendices B & C.

Harlow's Geographical Boundaries

Harrow contains 21 wards, 30 MSOAs, 137 LSOAs and 642 OAs. Wards in Harrow remain unchanged from the 2001 boundaries, but there is now one fewer MSOA in the borough and nine additional OAs. At the LSOA level a minor boundary realignment has resulted in LSOA 205 (in 2001) being renamed as LSOA 576 in 2011, but no properties were affected. The MSOA and OA changes reflect population change in the borough over the decade. Output areas (OAs) are the lowest level of geography produced across all census topics. A ward and 2001 LSOA map is shown in Appendix A.

- The average population in Harrow on 27th March 2011 was 372 in OAs, 1,745 in LSOAs, 7,969 in MSOAs and 11,384 in wards
- The average number of households in England and Wales on Census Day was 129 in OAs, 672 in LSOAs, 3,245 in MSOAs and 2,726 in electoral wards/divisions
- The average population in England and Wales on Census Day was 309 in OAs, 1,614 in LSOAs, 7,787 in MSOAs and 6,543 in electoral wards/divisions
- The average number of households in Harrow on 27th March 2011 was 131 in OAs, 615 in LSOAs, 2,809 in MSOAs and 4,013 in wards

Resident Population

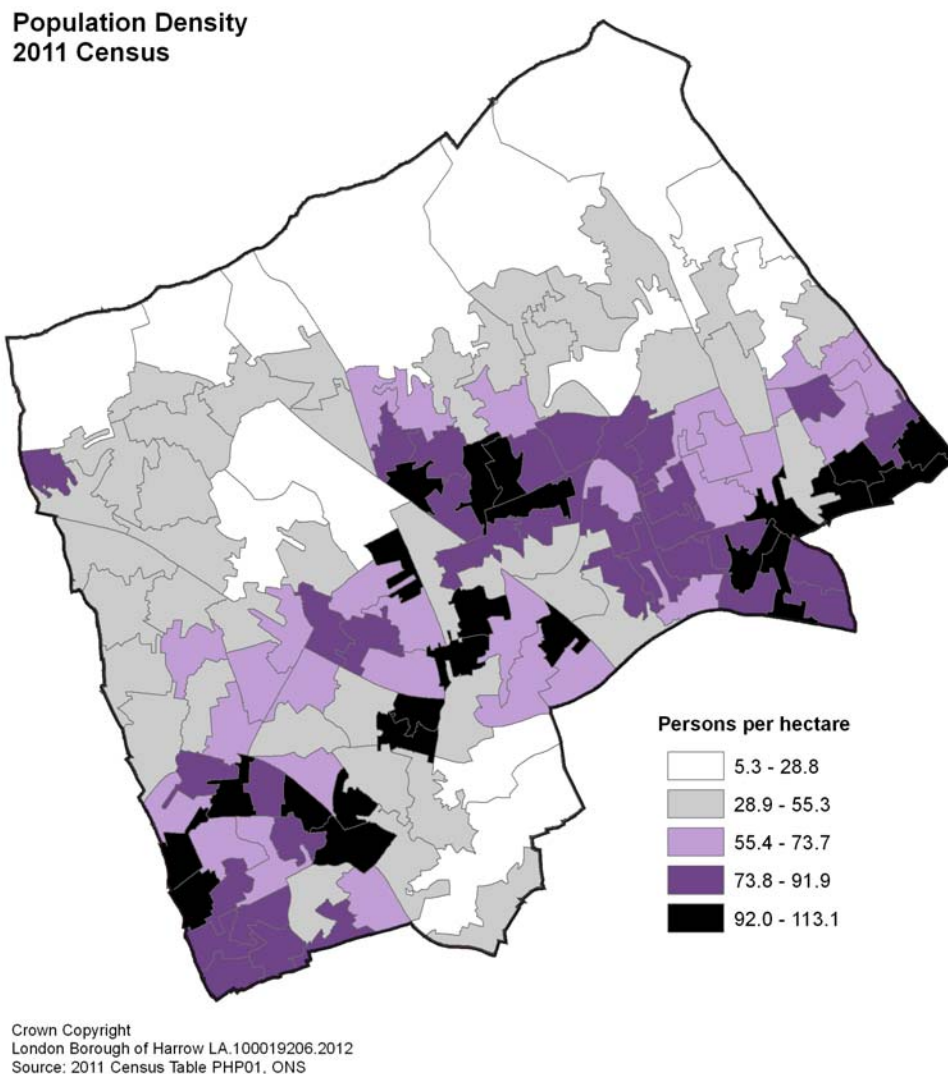
For the 2011 Census, a usual resident of the UK is anyone who, on Census Day 2011, was in the UK and had stayed or intended to stay in the UK for a period of 12 months. Students are recorded at their term-time address.

- The 2011 Census estimated that there were 239,056 people living in Harrow as at 27th March 2011, ranking Harrow 63rd out of the 348 local and unitary authorities in England & Wales (20th in London) based on the size of the resident population, where 1st is the most populous area

- Roxbourne is Harrow's largest ward in terms of population, with 12,828 residents, followed by Canons (12,405) and Greenhill (12,278)
- Pinner ward has the smallest population (10,026), followed by Headstone North (10,093) and West Harrow (10,373)
- The average population per ward is now 11,384
- Greenhill and Marlborough wards' population have grown by the highest amounts since 2001, at 33.2% (3,096) and 33.1% (3,052) respectively. This growth is more than double the overall borough's overall growth rate of 15.6% over the same period.
- The wards with the smallest population increase over the decade are Pinner (+4.4%, 425), Hatch End (+5.9%, 595) and Headstone North (+6%, 571)

Population Density

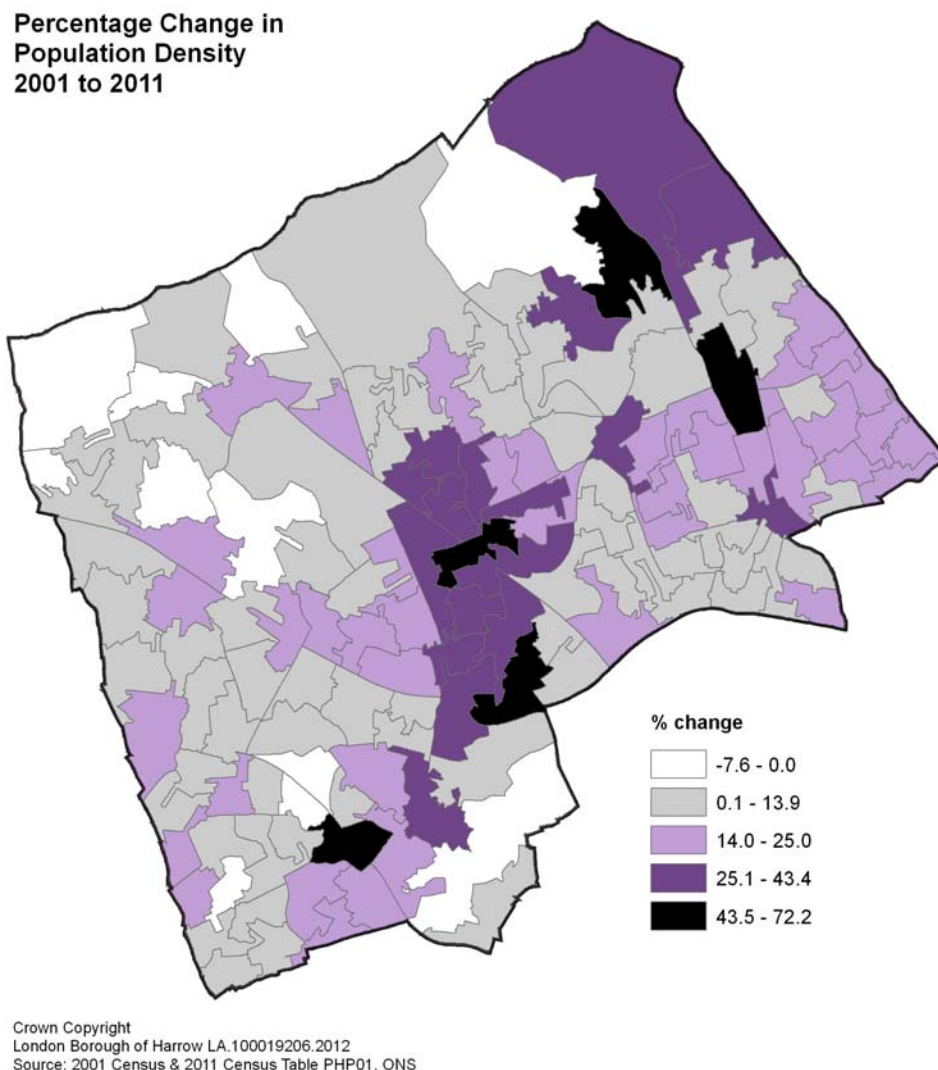

- The population density (number of usual residents per hectare [pph]) in Harrow in 2011 was 47.37, compared to 40.98 in 2001
- London's population density was 52 pph and England's was 4.1 pph in 2011

- Harrow is ranked 23rd out of the 348 local and unitary authorities in England & Wales (21st in London) for population density, where 1st is the most densely populated area
- The most densely populated wards are Wealdstone (95.5 pph), Kenton East (86.9 pph) and Roxbourne (85.2 pph)
- The least densely populated wards are Canons (22.1 pph), Harrow Weald (24.8 pph) and Stanmore Park (25.2 pph). These wards are all in the north of the borough and have large tracts of green belt land.
- At Lower Super Output Area Level (LSOA) the area to the south of Locket Road in Marlborough ward; part of West Harrow ward (Honeybun Estate, Vaughan Road and Butler Avenue); and the Byron Road/Church Lane part of Wealdstone ward have densities of between 111 and 113 pph. This level is more akin to Inner London borough densities.

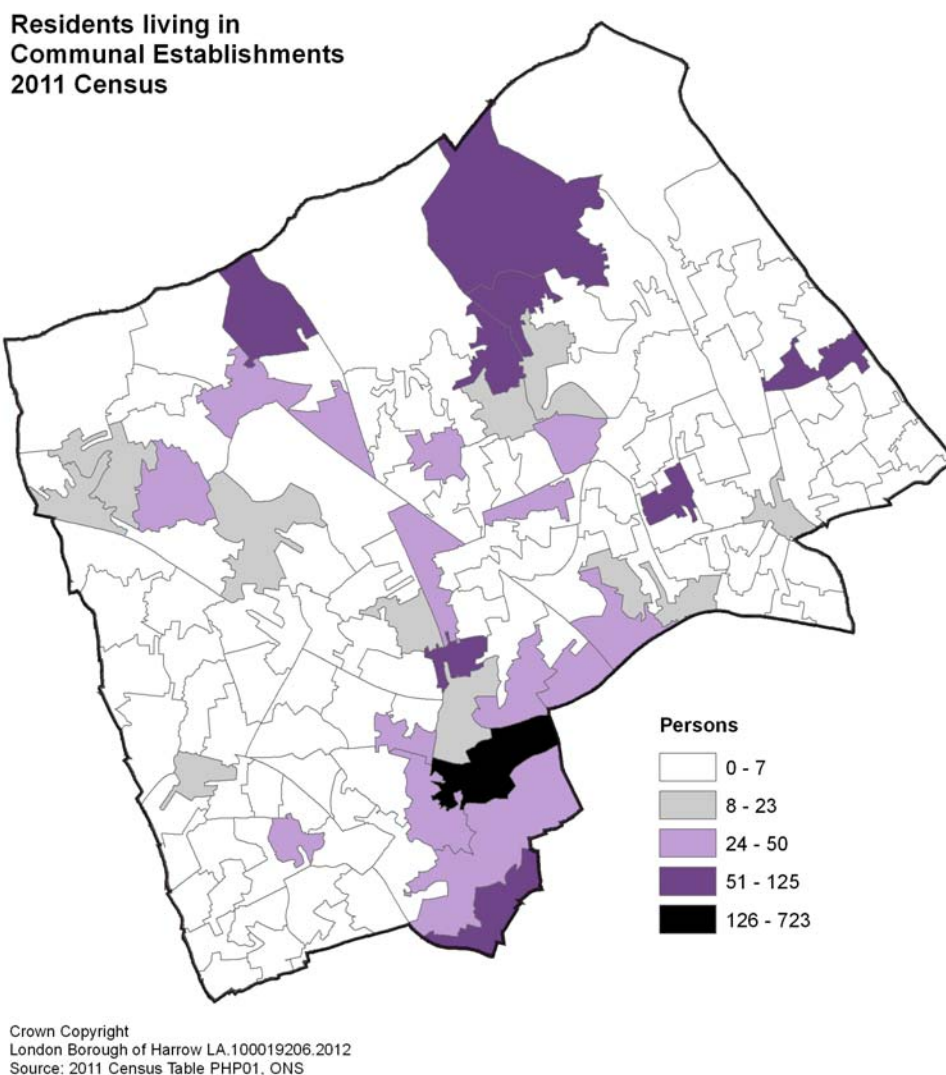
- The six LSOAs showing the highest density changes all coincide with areas where there have been significant amounts of new development over the past decade i.e. the redevelopment of RAF Stanmore Park; Stanmore Place in Honeypot Lane;

Wealdstone and Harrow town centres; and housing developments on Northolt Road and off Stanley Road in South Harrow.

Communal Establishments

A communal establishment resident is a person living in managed residential accommodation who has lived, or intends to live there for six months or more. Individuals resident in a communal establishment for less than six months are enumerated at their home address, apart from those with no usual address elsewhere who are also classified as residents.

- Harrow on the Hill ward has the largest population living in communal establishments with 888 residents, Harrow School being situated in this ward
- Other wards with significant numbers living in communal establishments are Stanmore Park (229), Hatch End (147) and Greenhill (142)
- Only Edgware ward has no residents recorded as living in communal establishments
- Only 0.9% (2,086) of Harrow's residents live in communal establishments, lower than England's rate of 1.8% and London's rate of 1.2%

- The 2011 Census for Harrow shows that the number of usual residents living in communal establishments has increased by around 370 or 21.6% since 2001. This increase is much higher than the national increase of 6.8% and London's increase of 7.2%.

Looking at the 2001 Census data at a ward level it is clear that Harrow School was under enumerated in the 2001 Census with only around 94 pupils (18-19 year olds) being recorded in the 2001 Census, considerably lower than the known number of pupils boarding at the school (over 800). When this is taken into account it appears that there may be fewer residents recorded as living in communal establishments in Harrow in 2011, compared to 2001.

The Census definition on communal establishments means that not every person living in a communal establishment will be recorded as such in the 2011 Census. Those people staying in hospitals, rehabilitation units and hotels on Census night are likely to have been counted at their usual home address, as will people who are only on short-term stays in care homes and nursing homes, if they have a home address. Therefore the 2011 Census count on people living in communal establishments will not give a comprehensive count of the number of the total number of people living in communal establishments in the borough or the number of bedspaces.

Households

A household is defined as one person living alone, or a group of people (not necessarily related) living at the same address who share cooking facilities and share a living room, sitting room or dining area.

The information released to date counts households with at least one usual resident.

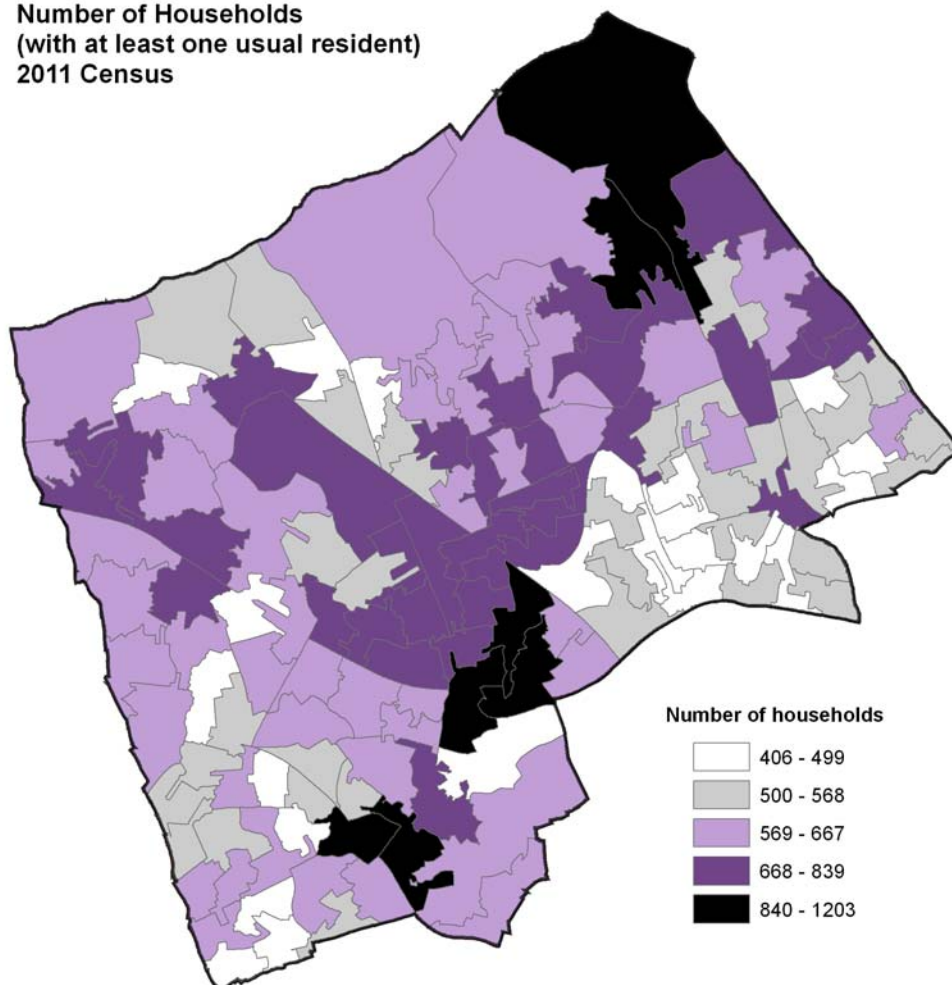
- Overall there was a 6.5% (5,150) increase in the number of households in Harrow between 2001 and 2011, from 79,112 in 2001 to 84,268 in 2011
- At ward level there has been considerable variation in the change in the number of households. Greenhill ward has seen the biggest increase in the number of households over the decade with 882 additional households (+21.6%), followed by Marlborough ward (667 households, +18.3%) and Canons ward (587 households, +13.9%).

All these wards have experienced high levels of housebuilding over the past decade, although LBH Planning records show that Roxbourne ward recorded the highest net number of housing completions between 2001 and 2011, with nearly 650 additional housing units (showing an 8.4% or 349 household gain between censuses). This shows that wards with high numbers of housing completions do not all correlate with correspondingly high increases in Census households. There may be several different reasons for this: dwellings and households are not the same thing; there may be more second homes in some areas than others; or the 2001 Census data may not have been very accurate. It has been acknowledged that there were known sampling errors in the 2001 Census and hard to count areas may have been under enumerated. The 2011 Census made every effort to overcome these difficulties.

- Two wards have shown a decrease in the number of households between censuses. These were West Harrow with a 1.8% fall (67 fewer households) and Roxeth ward (1% fall, with 40 fewer households). Kenton West, Rayners Lane, Harrow on the Hill and Pinner wards all showed household growth of less than 2%.

2011 Census



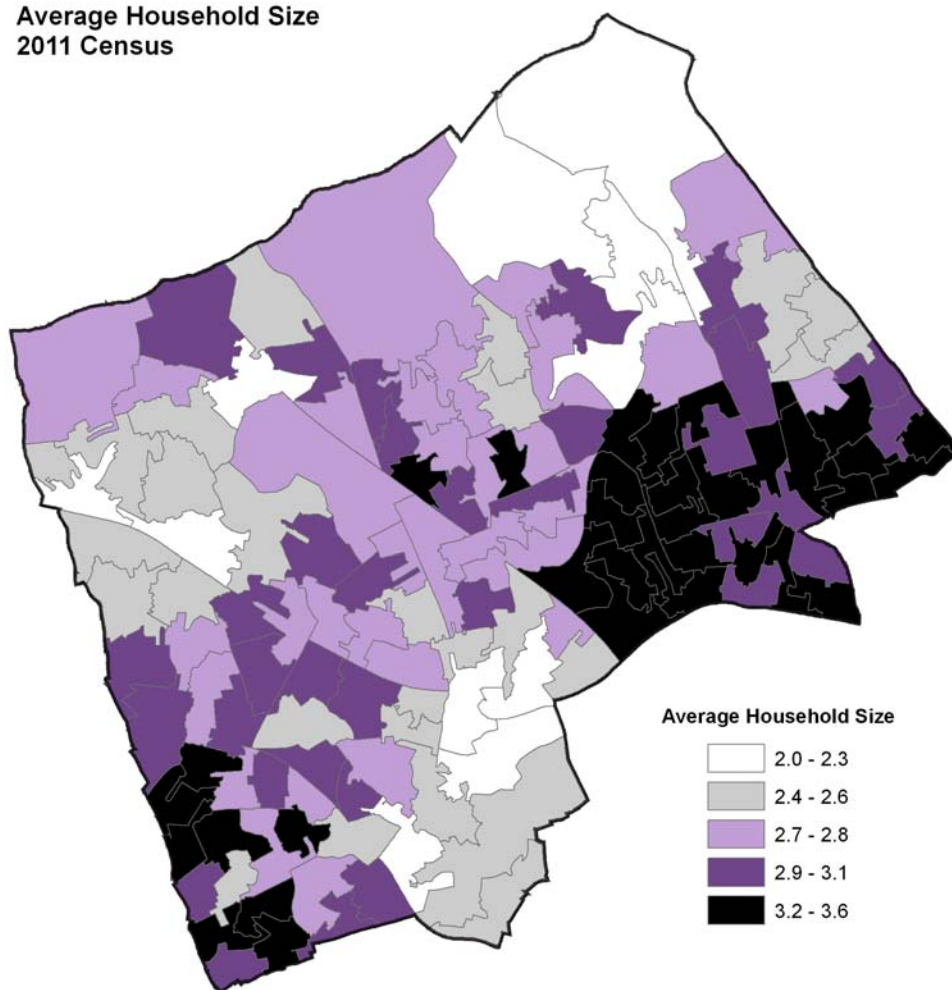

Average Household Size

- Harrow's average household size (AHS) increased from 2.6 in 2001 to 2.8 in 2011
- Harrow has the second highest AHS of all local authorities in England and Wales, after Newham
- On a ward basis the AHS varies from a low of 2.4 in Pinner ward to a high of 3.3 in Kenton West and Queensbury wards
- The AHS has increased in all of Harrow's wards over the past decade. The wards which have shown the biggest changes over the decade are: Wealdstone (+14.6%); Roxeth (+13.1%); Queensbury (+12.6%); and Greenhill (+12.1%). Pinner and Hatch End wards showed the smallest increases in AHS, at 2.4%.
- At the LSOA level there are two LSOAs with an AHS of 3.6. These LSOAs are adjoining LSOAs in Queensbury and Edgware wards. There are no LSOAs in the borough with an AHS below two, but LSOA 114 in the north of Canons ward has an AHS of two (Map 5).

Age Breakdowns

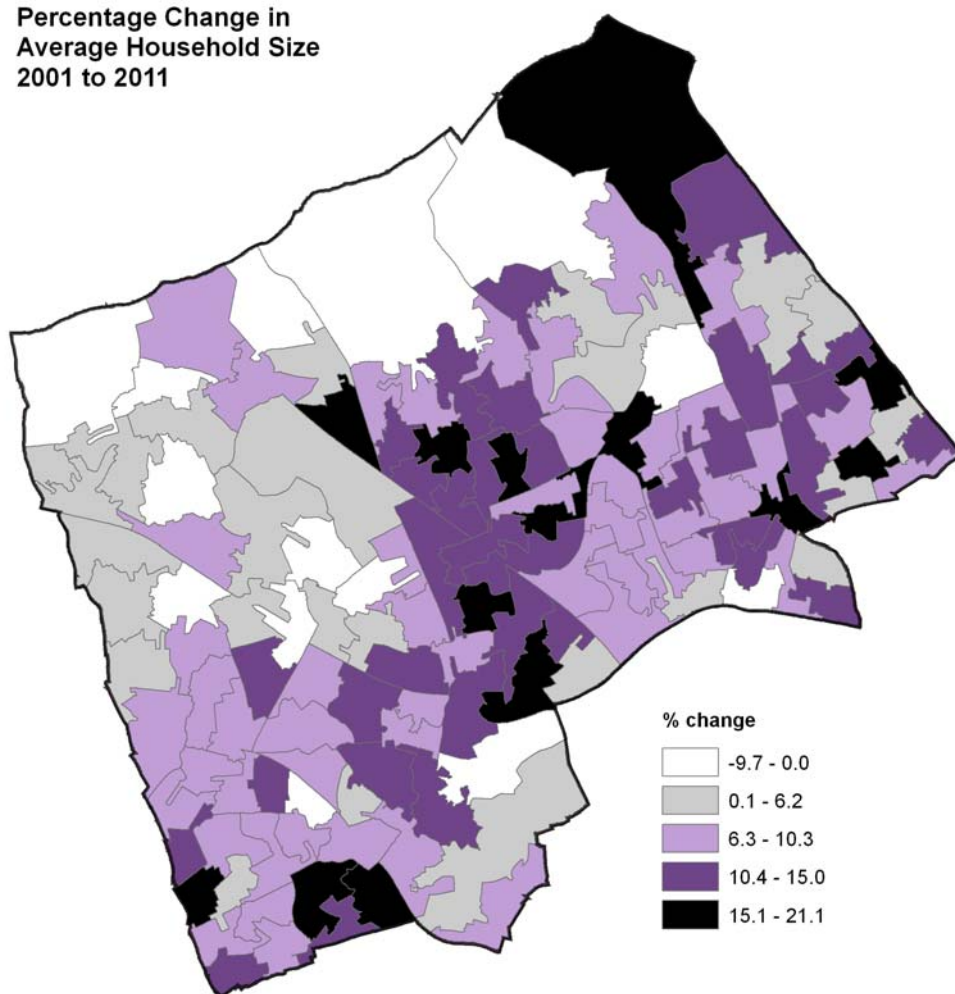
The latest 2011 Census data to be published gives breakdowns of the population by five-year age groups. It is therefore not possible at present to undertake any sub-borough analyses of the changes in the number of children aged 0-15 or the working age group, aged 16-64. Census Briefing Notes 2 and 3 give a borough level analysis of these broad population groups, including the older population, aged 65 and over.

Ward level data for the five-year age cohorts (from the 2001 and 2011 Censuses) can be found in Appendix B.

The following maps illustrate how the data can be analysed, at LSOA and ward level, and are based on age groups 0-4, 0-14, 15-64, 65+ and 80+. The maps give counts of the numbers within each age group, as well as the percentage change in each LSOA over the past decade. Alternatively, the size of the population groups could be analysed as a percentage of the total population.

2001 to 2011



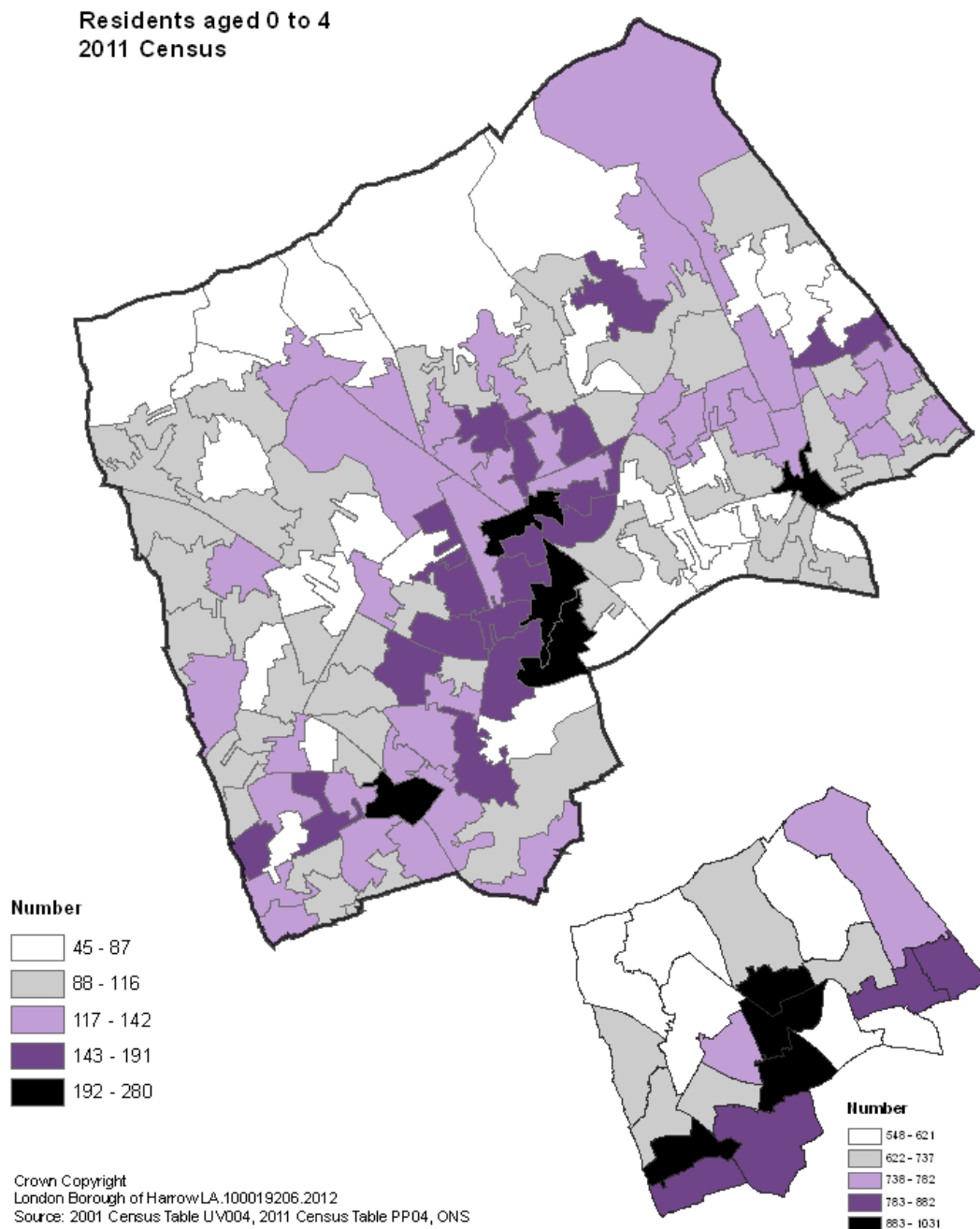

Residents aged 0-4

Map 7 shows the distribution of children aged under five across the borough at LSOA and ward level. Map 8 shows the change in this age group at LSOA level over the past decade.

- The wards with the highest numbers of under 5s are Roxbourne (1,031) and the central area wards of Marlborough (965), Greenhill (941) and Wealdstone (933). Over 8% of the resident population in Wealdstone and Roxbourne wards are aged under 5.
- Pinner and Headstone North wards have the fewest number of young children with 548 and 569 under 5s respectively, but Stanmore Park, Kenton West and Kenton East have the lowest percentage of under 5s, at 5.4%
- At ward level, Greenhill (+92.4%), Canons (+86.6%) and Wealdstone (81.9%) wards have seen the largest amount of growth in the under 5 population over the decade. No wards have seen a fall in the numbers in this population group.

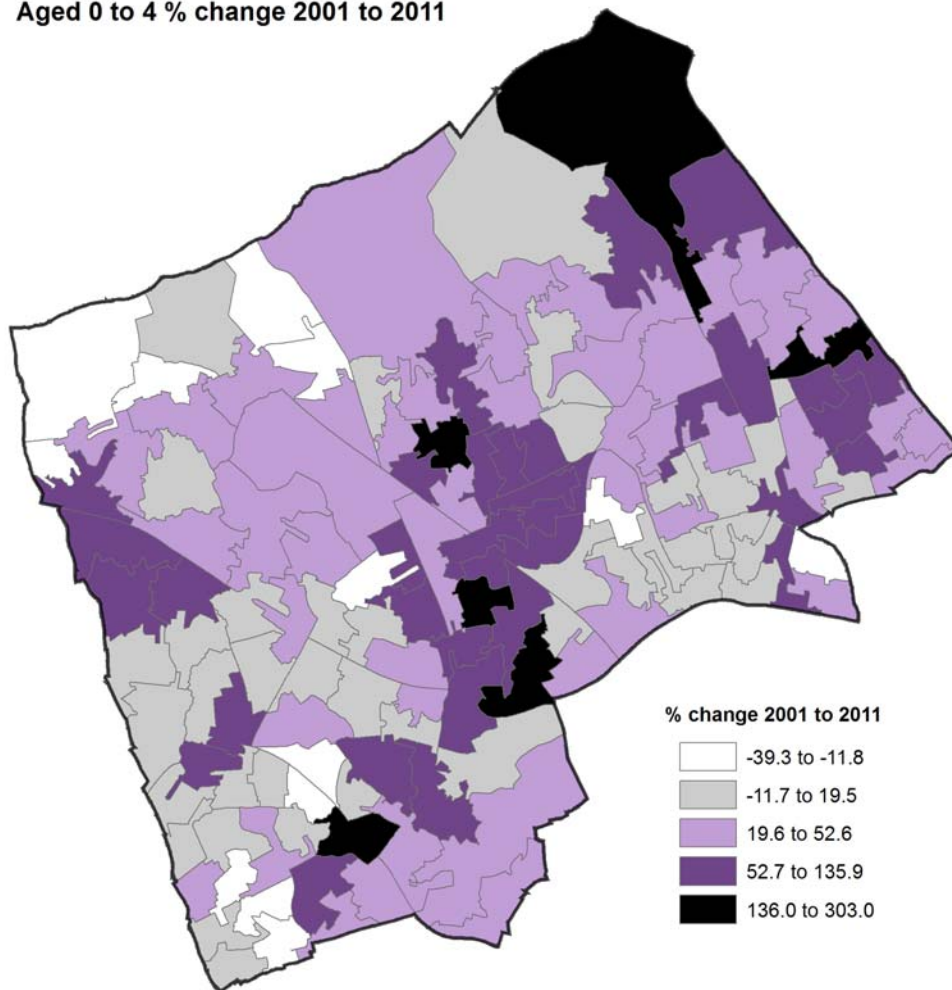

- In percentage terms the biggest changes at LSOA level, over the decade, have occurred in: Canons (+303% in LSOA 114), largely due to the redevelopment of the BAE Systems site; in Greenhill (+242% in LSOA 126); and in Wealdstone (+206% in LSOA 232)
- 23 LSOAs showed reduced numbers of under 5s since 2001, with the largest reduction of -39.3% in LSOA 217 in Roxbourne ward, an area which covers the Rayners Lane Estate. At the time of the 2011 Census significant parts of the estate were still under construction and large parts were vacant, awaiting demolition and reconstruction.

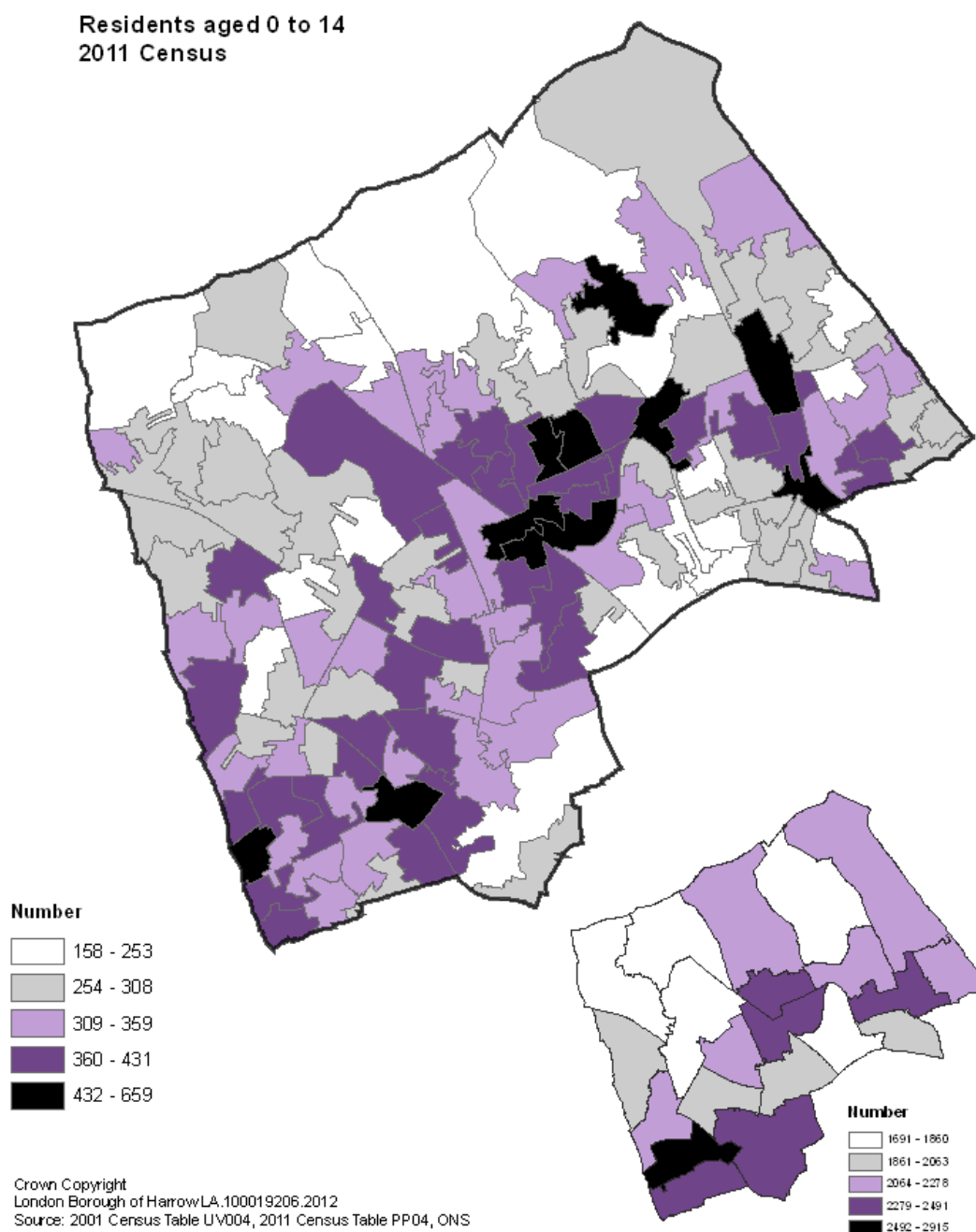
Residents aged 0-14

Map 9 shows the distribution of children aged 0 to 14 across the borough at LSOA and ward level. Map 10 shows the change in this age group at LSOA level over the past decade.

- Roxbourne ward has the highest number and percentage of children aged 0 to 14 with 2,915 (22.7%) residents in this age group
- Pinner and Headstone North wards have the fewest number of children with 1,691 and 1,699 aged under 15 respectively. However, the wards with the lowest percentage of 0 to 14 years olds are Stanmore Park and Greenhill (16.1%).
- Three wards have seen the biggest increases over the decade - Marlborough (+46.7%), Greenhill (+45.2%) and Wealdstone (+41.5%). Two wards saw decreases - Kenton West (-9.1%) and Headstone North (-1.1%).
- In percentage terms, at LSOA level, the biggest increases have occurred in: Greenhill (+142% in LSOA 126); in Canons (+123% in LSOA 114); and in Roxbourne (+123% in LSOA 213)

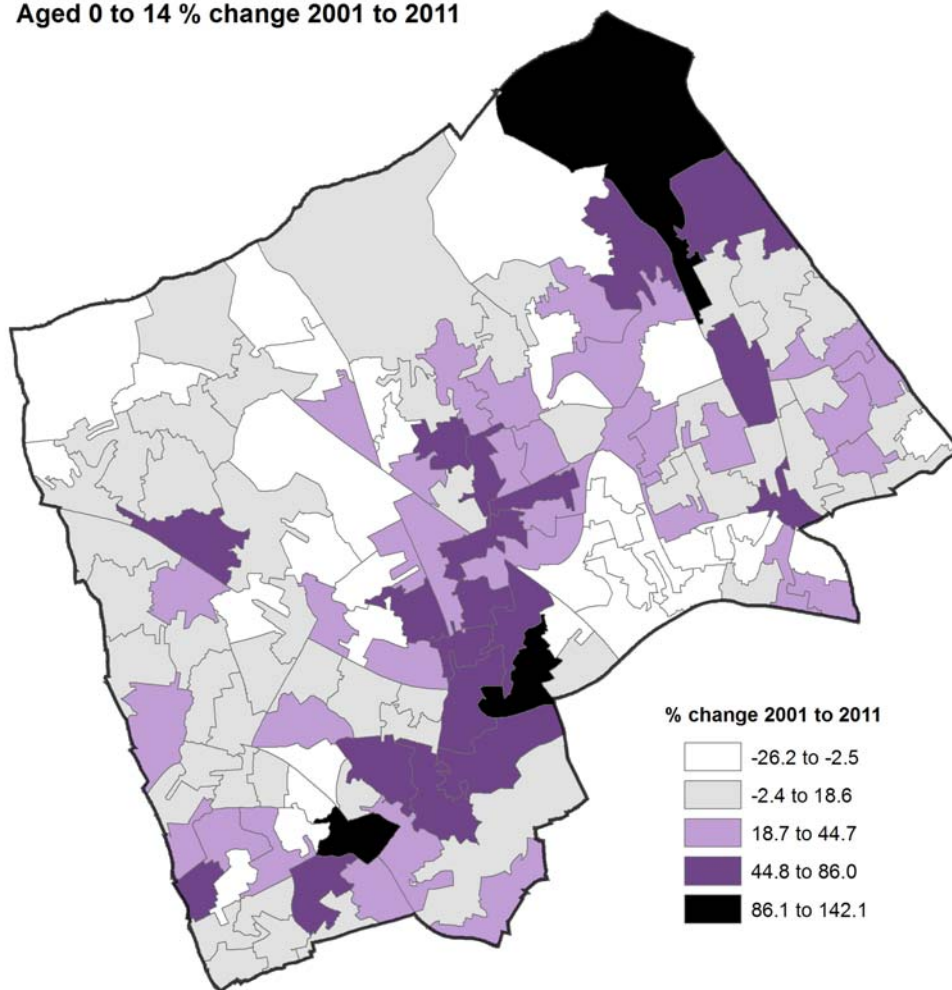
- 38 LSOAs recorded a loss in the number of residents aged 0-14 over the decade, with the biggest falls in Hatch End (-26.2% in LSOA 147) and Roxbourne (-24.7% in LSOA 217)

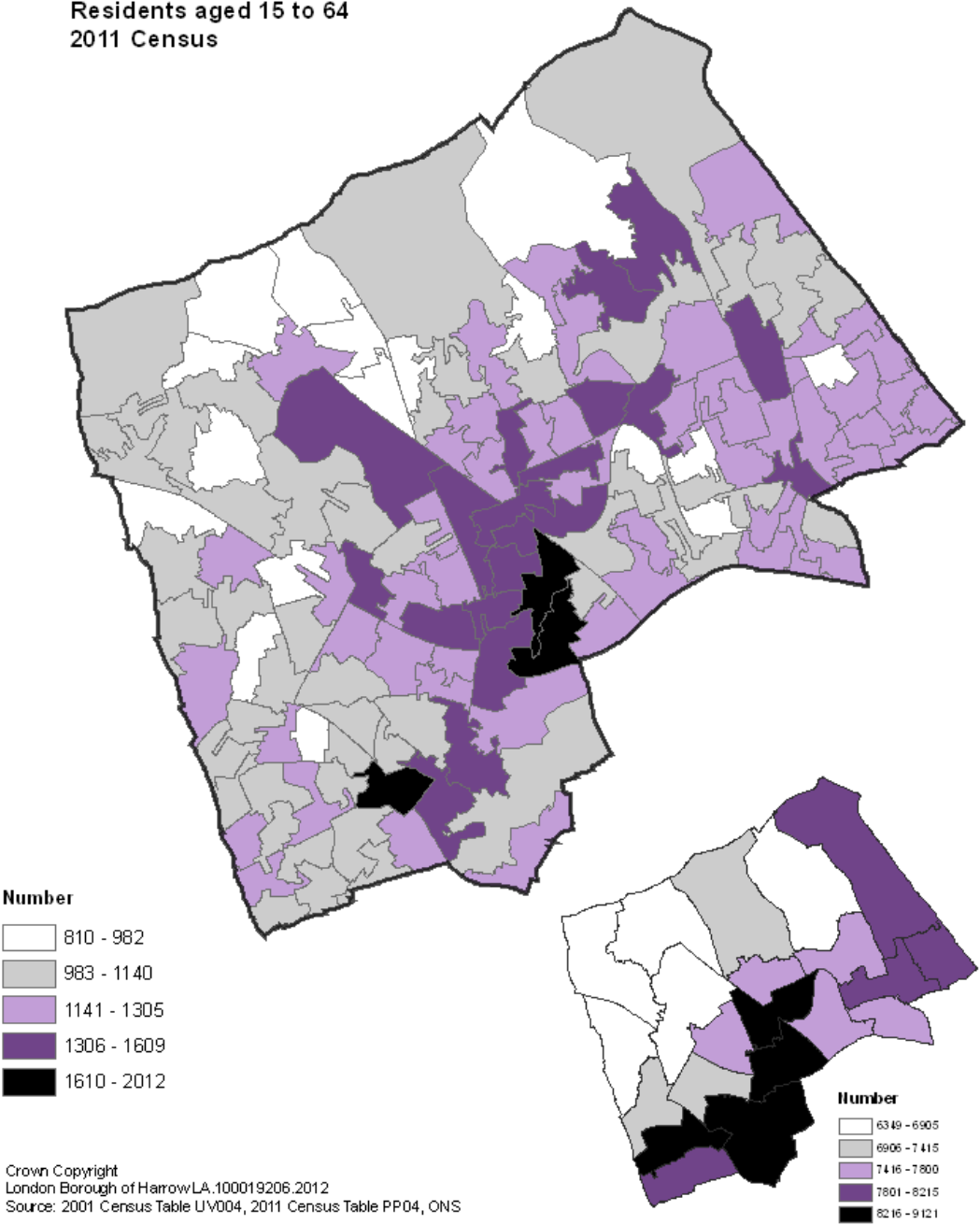
Residents aged 15-64

Map 11 shows the distribution of residents aged 15-64 across the borough at LSOA and ward level. Map 12 shows the change in this age group at LSOA level over the past decade.

- Greenhill ward has the highest number of residents aged 15-64 with 9,121 people in this age group, with the adjoining wards of Roxbourne, Marlborough and Harrow on the Hill all having over 8,500 residents of this age.
- Pinner and Pinner South wards have fewer than 6,600 residents of this age
- At the LSOA level LSOA 126 (in Greenhill) and LSOA 213 in Roxbourne have over 2,000 residents aged 15-64
- Greenhill ward has seen the biggest population increase over the decade (+36.3%), followed by Marlborough (+32.2%)
- In percentage terms, the biggest increases at LSOA level since 2001, have occurred in Roxbourne (+72% in LSOA 213) and Greenhill (+71% in LSOA 126)

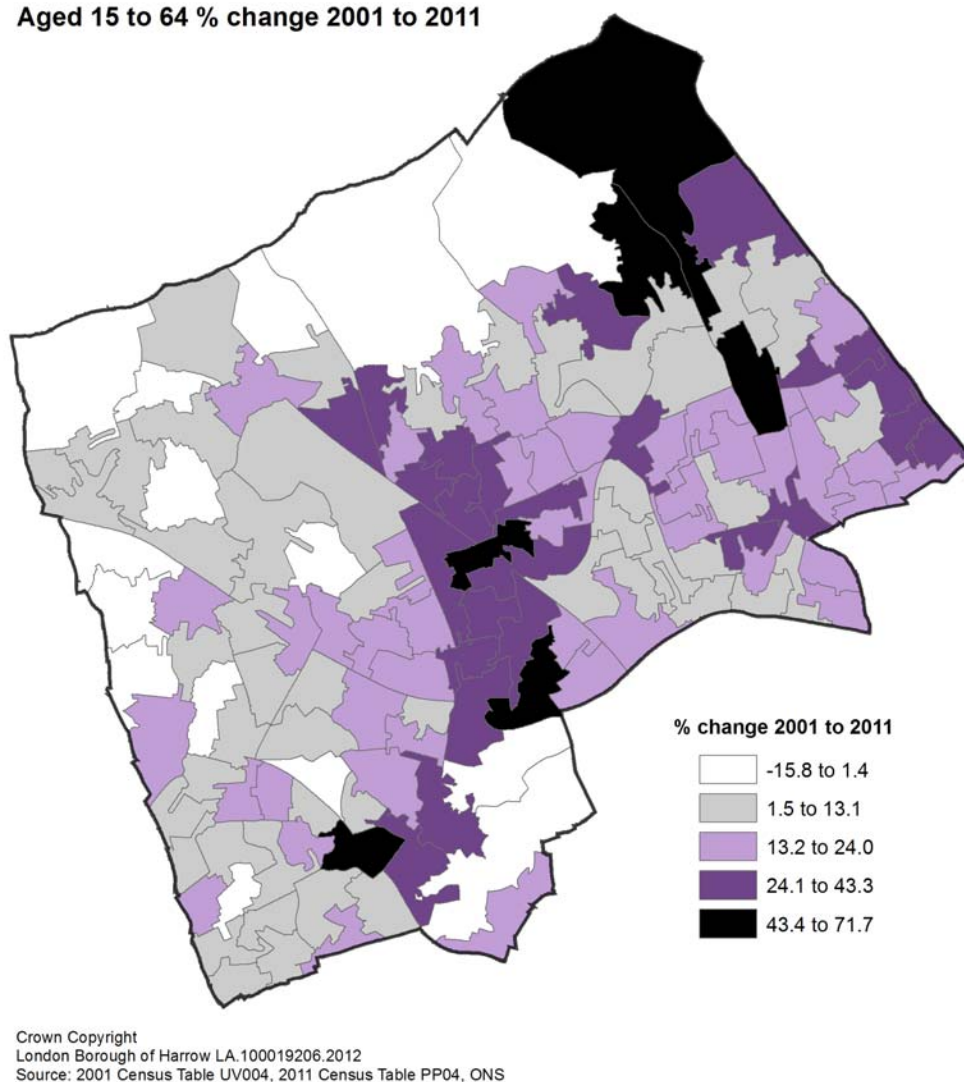
Map 11

Residents aged 65 and over

Map 13 shows the distribution of residents aged 65 and over across the borough at LSOA and ward level. Map 14 shows the change in this age group at LSOA level over the past decade.

- Stanmore Park ward has the highest number of residents aged 65+ with 2,520 people in this age group and, at 22.4%, the highest concentration of residents of this age group at ward level
- Generally the wards to the north of the borough have the highest numbers of residents aged 65+. 20% of residents in Canons (2,445), Hatch End (2,120) and Pinner (1,986) wards are aged 65 and over.
- Wealdstone (1,249), Roxbourne (1,255), Greenhill (1,291) and Marlborough (1,303) wards have the fewest number of residents of this age, with Roxbourne having the lowest percentage, at 9.8%
- At the LSOA level, LSOA 114 (in Canons), and LSOAs 225 and 226 in Stanmore Park have the highest number of residents aged 65+, with between 560 and 580 people. LSOA 225 has the highest concentration, with 36.5% of residents of this

- Kenton West and Stanmore Park wards have seen the biggest population increases over the decade, with increases of 30.8% and 29.3% respectively. No wards recorded a decrease in the population of this age group.
- At the LSOA level, in percentage terms by far the biggest increases have occurred in Stanmore Park (+92% in LSOA 228) and Kenton West (+57.8% in LSOA 172). Six other LSOAs recorded a change of more than 40% since 2001.
- In 23 LSOAs the number of residents aged 65 and over fell over the decade, with the biggest falls in Kenton East (LSOA 168, -24.8%) and Harrow Weald (LSOA 139, -23.5%)

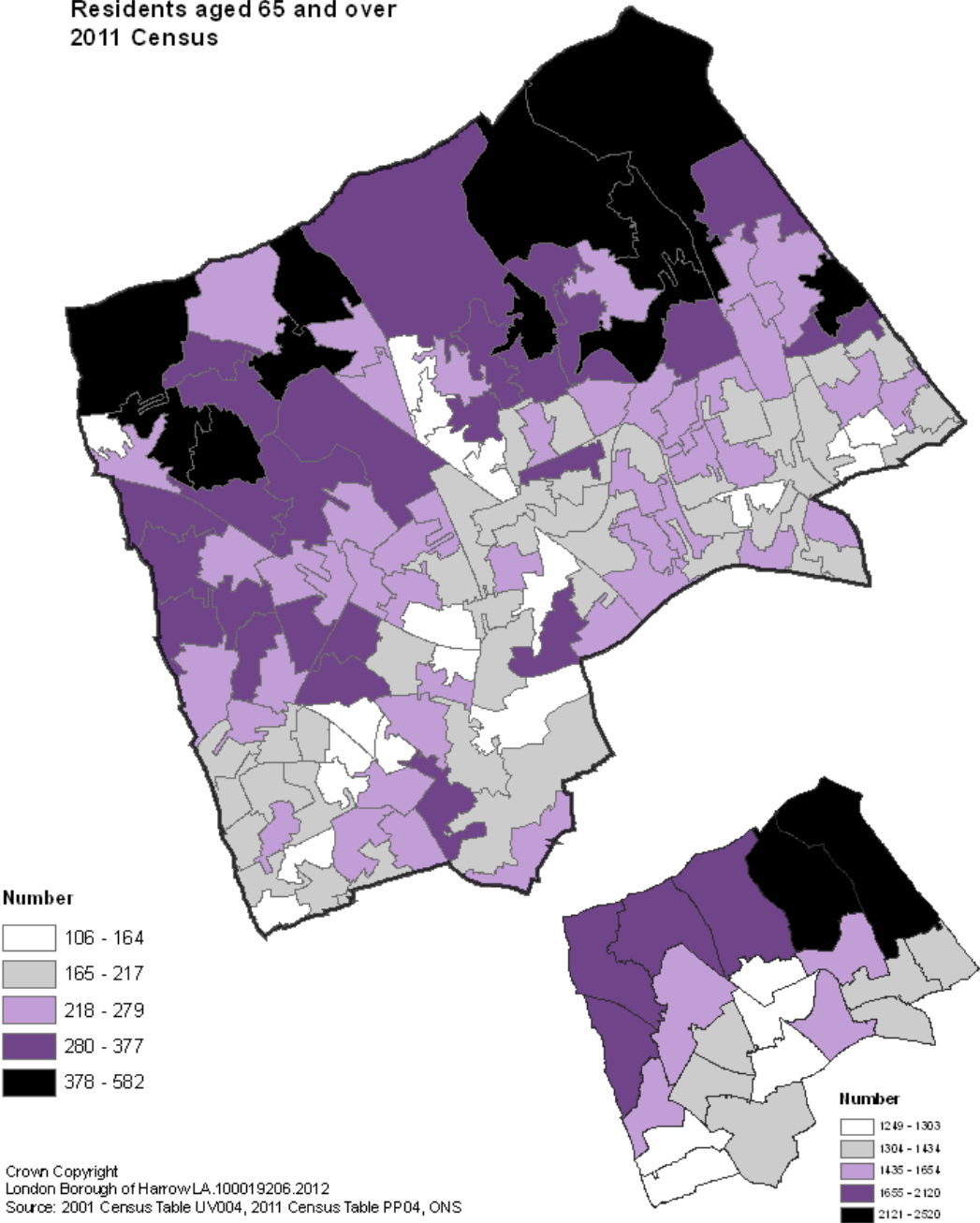
Residents aged 80 and over

Map 15 shows the distribution of residents aged 80 and over across the borough at LSOA and ward level. Map 16 shows the change in this age group at LSOA level over the past decade.

- Canons (923) and Stanmore Park (861) have the highest number of residents aged 80 and over, with 7.7% and 7.4% of all residents falling within this age group
- Generally the wards to the north of the borough have the highest numbers of residents aged 80 and over
- There are a number of wards where only around 2.7% to 2.9% of residents are aged 80 and over. Roxeth (327) ward has the fewest number of residents of this age, with Marlborough and Greenhill wards having the lowest percentages, at 2.7%
- At the LSOA level, LSOA 114 (in Canons), and LSOAs 225 and 226 in Stanmore Park have the highest number of residents aged 80 and over, with between 207 and 227 people. LSOAs 114 and 225 have the highest concentration, with 13.9% and 14.5% residents of this age. LSOA 130 in Greenhill ward has the lowest number and concentration of residents aged 80 and over, with 17 residents, just 0.75% of all residents.
- Kenton West (+113), Stanmore Park (+215) and Headstone North (+123) wards have seen the largest amount of growth at ward level, but in percentage terms Kenton West is the highest, at 43.1%. Greenhill saw an 18.1% decline in the over 80 population, Harrow Weald, a 3.7% fall and Belmont, a 2.3% fall.
- At the LSOA level, in percentage terms by far the biggest increase in this age group, over the decade, has occurred in Kenton West (+187% in LSOA 172), but there are four other LSOAs where the growth has been between 106% and 114% - these LSOAs are in Hatch End, Kenton East, Kenton West and Stanmore Park
- In 43 LSOAs the number of residents aged 80 and over fell over the decade, with the biggest falls in Greenhill (LSOA 130, -51.4%) and West Harrow (LSOA 237, -53.1%)

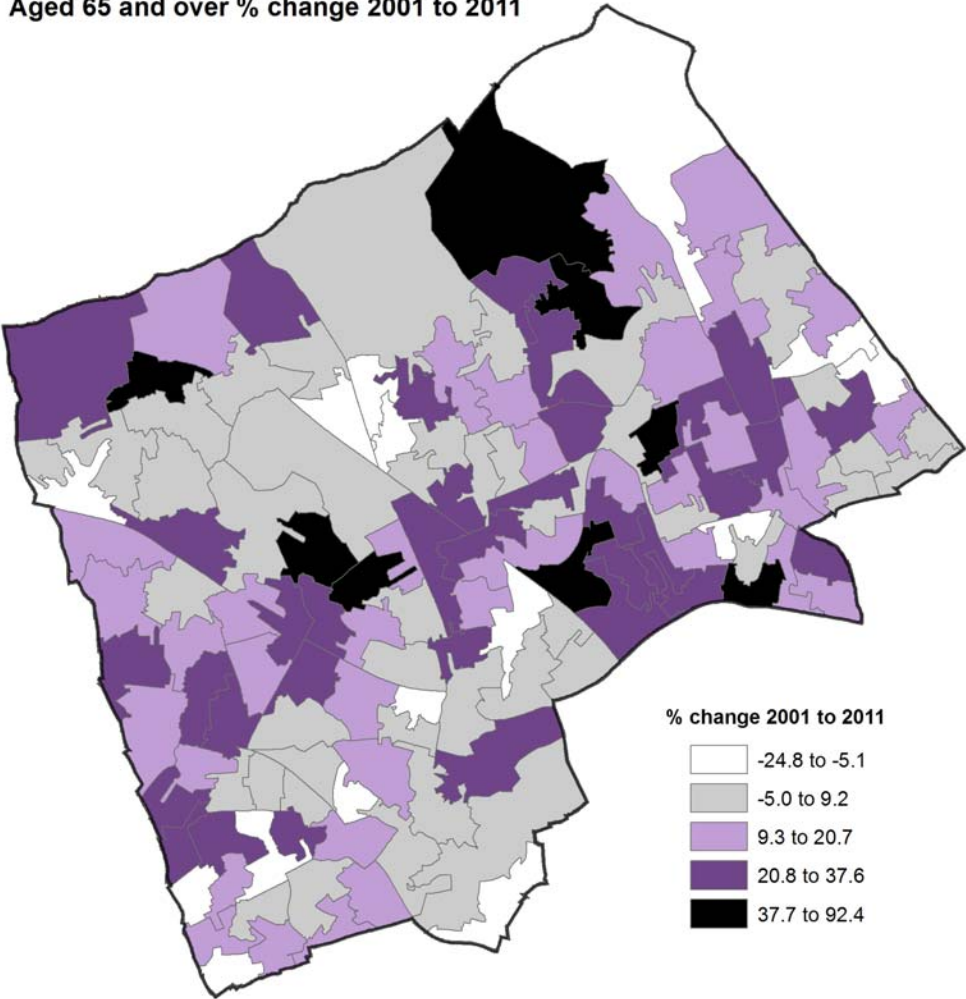
Map 13

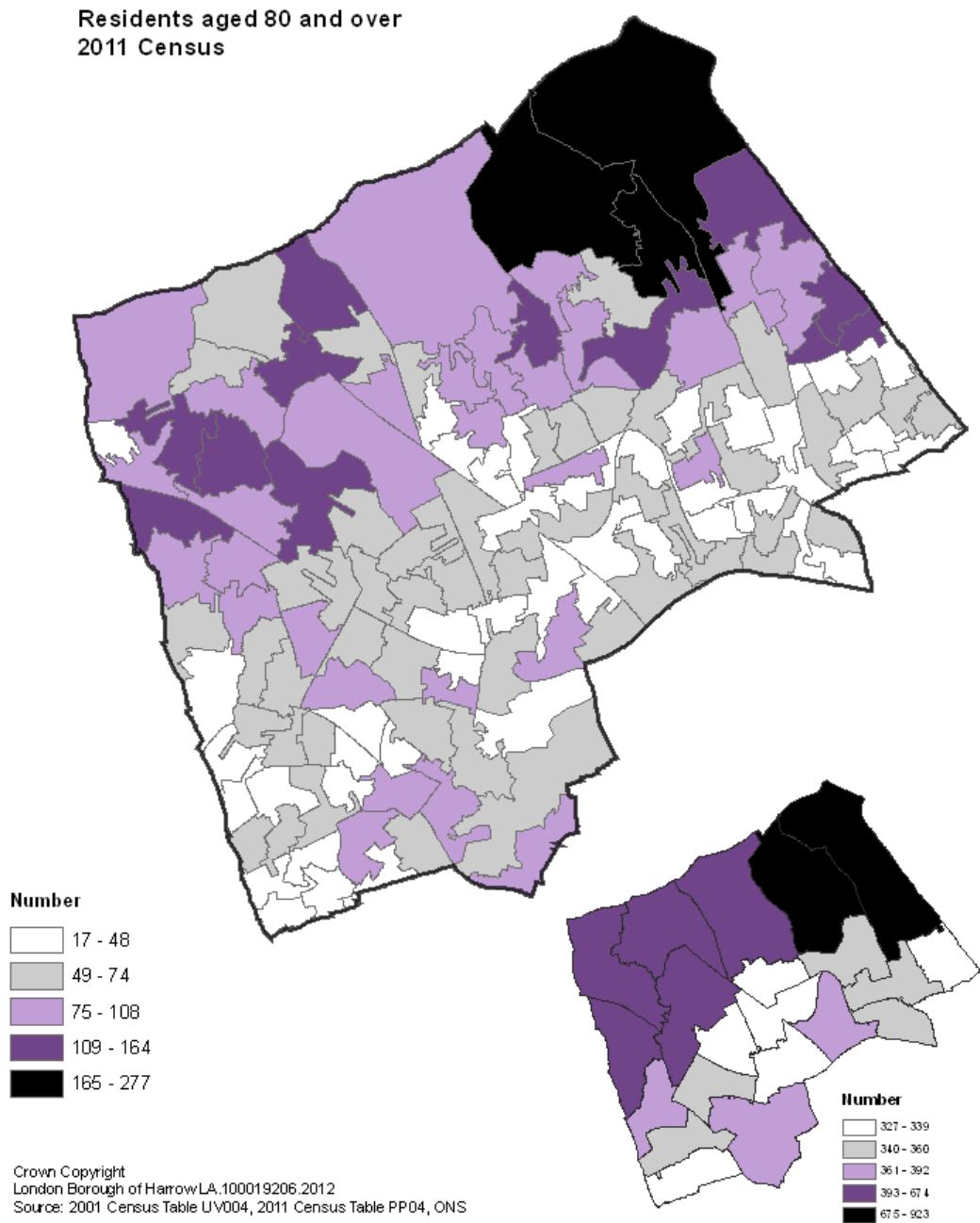
Aged 65 and over % change 2001 to 2011

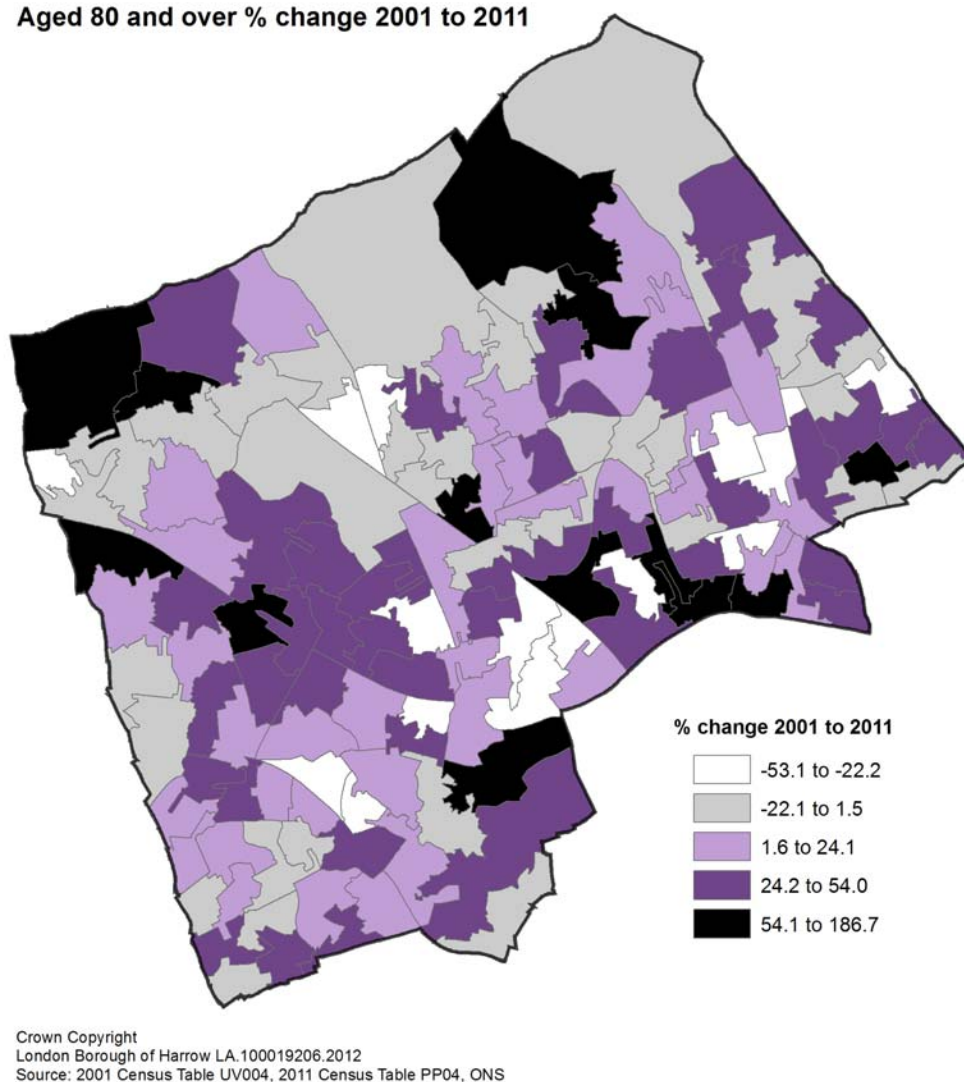

Second Homes

Information on people with second addresses was published at a local authority level on 22nd October 2012. The data was recorded for the first time in the 2011 Census, so there are no comparisons with previous years.

Table 1 gives information about:

- People who were usually resident in Harrow, but who also live at a second address in a different local authority in England & Wales or another country for at least 30 days per year; and
 - People who live at a second address within Harrow for at least 30 days per year, but who were usually resident elsewhere.
- 4,322 residents, whose usual address is in Harrow, have a second address elsewhere in England & Wales (Table 1a). This equates to 18 per 1,000 usual residents. This is below both the Outer and Inner London borough averages of 5,095 and 9,442 residents respectively.

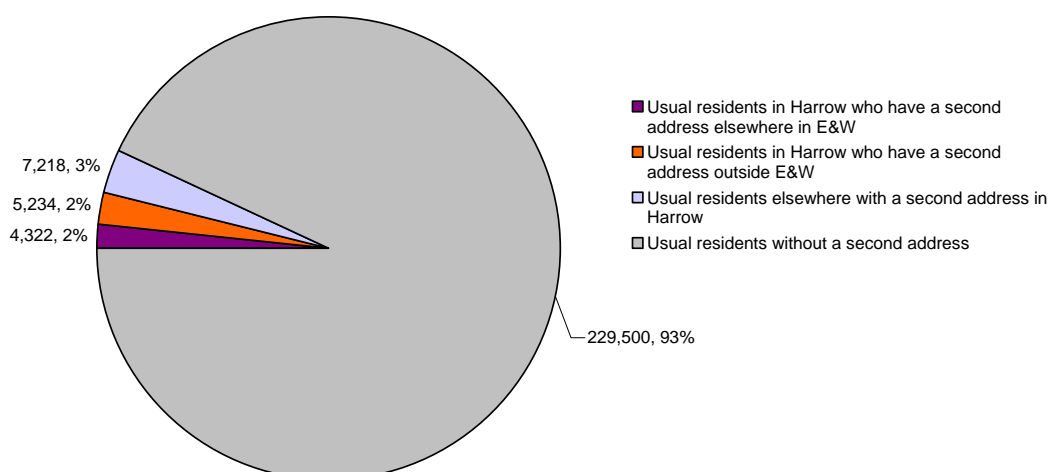

- 93 of Harrow's usual residents have a second address in Scotland or Northern Ireland (below the Outer London average of 142) and 5,141 residents have a second address outside of the UK, approximately the average number for an Outer London borough (Table 1b).
- In total 7,218 people (30 per 1,000 usual residents) who are usually resident in other parts of the country have a second address in Harrow (Table 1c). The average for the Outer London boroughs is 6,556 and 7,517 for the Inner London boroughs.

Figure 1 shows that 93% of people who are usually resident in Harrow do not have a second home where they reside more than 30 days per year. 3% of usual residents elsewhere have a second address in Harrow and 4% of Harrow's residents have a second address either inside or outside the UK. Although Harrow's usually resident population is 239,056, the minimum number of residents in the borough is potentially around 230,400 (if all those with second homes are away at the same time) and the maximum number is around 246,300 (if those with a usual address outside of Harrow are present in Harrow at the same time).

Typical second addresses include armed forces bases, addresses used by people working away from home, a student's home address, the address of another parent or guardian, or a holiday home. If a person with a second address was staying at that address on census night, they were classed as a visitor to that address, but counted as a usual resident at their home address.

'Other' types of second address account for the majority of second addresses of both Harrow's residents with a second address outside of Harrow and those people with a second address in Harrow. Harrow School boys are counted as having a second address outside of the borough. Harrow has a below average number of people in the category 'Usual residents in Harrow, with a second address outside of Harrow', compared to the Inner and Outer London averages because, other than Harrow School, there are no large scale student campuses in the borough (Table 1a).

Students living away (with a parental or guardian's address in Harrow) are recorded as having a second address in Harrow and they probably account for a large proportion of the people in Table 1c, as well as the second addresses of children of separated parents. The ONS has stated that the estimates of the number of people with second addresses used for holidays were "not equivalent to an estimate of holiday homes. These estimates could include, for example, addresses that are used over the course of the year, by more than one person".

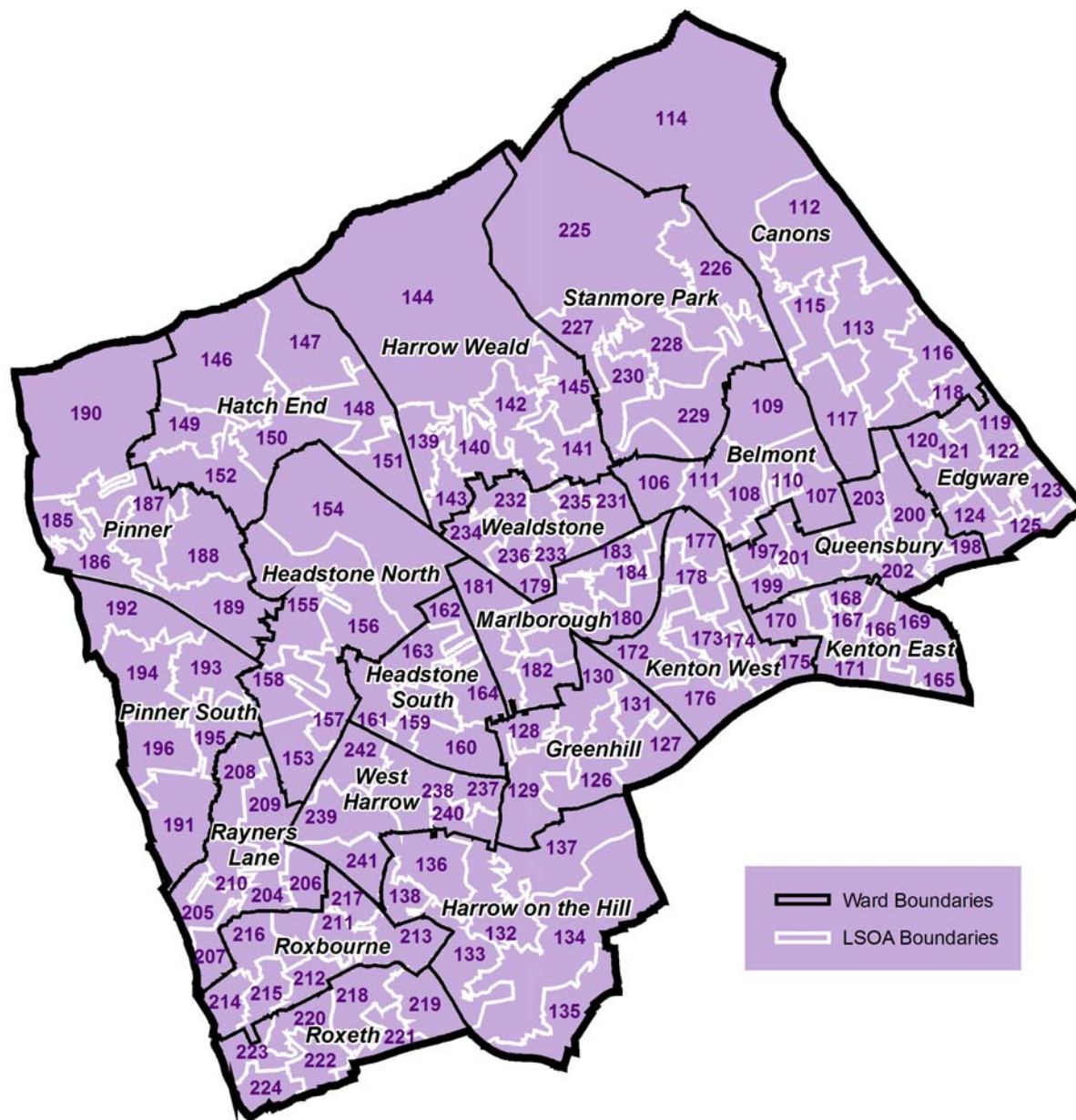
