

... PARKS

Our park life is about to get even better - thanks to £93,000 of pocket park funding awarded to our four 'Friends of' user groups. Harrow won nearly 10% of the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government's total £1million funding, which will fund projects including walking routes, exercise areas, a toddlers' playground and pond at Harrow Weald, Harrow Rec. Rayners Mead and Pinner Village Gardens.

If you use Harrow & Wealdstone station you might have noticed some disruption over Easter and there's a bit more to come over the early May bank holiday. But don't worry – it's all in aid of a much-needed upgrade. Work was due to begin as we went to press, to repaint and replace windows, refurbish the bridge and lifts. Work is due to go on until December. Lifts will remain in use throughout. The £3.7million revamp comes after years of lobbying by Harrow Council.

... PARKING

There's no need to fiddle about with forms, fish for loose change or leave an engagement early to top up the meter, as Harrow becomes the latest council to scrap old-fashioned paper parking permits. Now all your car park and street parking payments can be made at the touch of a button using the PayByPhone app. Virtual parking permits come into effect in June.

It takes seconds to register and the app even helps you find a parking space.

It's not just doctors and nurses making patients feel better at the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital in Stanmore. Luna, a Labrador/ retriever cross, brings a dose of affection, smiles and comfort whenever she is on call.

The four-year-old, together with owner Judith Hart, visits the hospital's spinal injuries unit for an hour every fortnight. She stays on the lead as they walk round and visit patients who can talk to and play with her.

Luna is part of Pets As Therapy, a national charity providing therapeutic visits to hospitals, hospices, care homes and special needs schools by volunteers with their own friendly, temperament-tested and vaccinated dogs and cats.


"Patients find her comforting because she is so friendly and always approaches them gently," says Judith. "At home she is playful, but once she gets her PAT jacket on she goes into work mode.

"Some patients are lonely, others might be missing a pet at home. Some have been there a long time and the staff enjoy making a fuss of her. too."

Luna was destined to be a guide dog but had to be withdrawn as she had a hip problem.

"Because of her nature and her background - and because I didn't want a pampered pooch - it's lovely to put all that good behaviour to good use," said Judith, a retired nurse who lives in Pinner.

"Even when we're walking down the street. Luna loves to be



stroked. You never know what's going on in people's lives and if she might be helping - and Luna just laps it up."

Pets As Therapy was set up in 1983, recognising the medical benefits associated with petting an animal - including reducing blood pressure and stress levels.

'Adult Social Care' is a term that's been in the news a lot recently. Demand for it is going up, and councils across the country, including Harrow, are raising council tax because of it. But what does it actually mean?

n this first in a series designed to explain adult social care, we look at services for people with learning disabilities – these cost Harrow Council more than £22 million last year – roughly a third of the total adult social care budget.

What are learning disabilities?

Having a learning disability means living with a lifelong reduction in intellectual ability. If you have a mild disability, you are likely to be able to live an independent life. If it's more severe you may need help with household tasks, or socialising, or managing money. A profound learning disability means you'll have a severely limited understanding of the world. You may also have physical disabilities and are likely to need constant care.

Approximately 4,000 people in Harrow have a learning disability – that's roughly 1 person in 60. Last year 579 of these people received some



kind of help from the council – 90% of them were adults of working age.

We pay for round-the-clock care for 173 Harrow people

who need it – but residential and nursing care is very expensive, costing the council more than £1,000 per week.

The total cost of that care

last year was more than £12 million, funded by your Council Tax.

Demand for learning disability services is increasing, mostly

due to rising life expectancy. We helped 53 more people last year than we did in 2015.

That's an increase of 10%, and this rate of growth is

Rogues' gallery



We're always on the lookout for bad behaviour and ways to make Harrow safer and better. Here are some of the rogues we recently brought to justice...

CRIME AGAINST FASHION

A rogue trader who flogged fake Louis Vuitton handbags for £30, now has to pay over £1,000 after police and Council Trading Standards officers swooped on his home and van. Habibullah Salary, from Harrow, was caught with knock-off designer bags with a street value of £23,000.

He was ordered to do 60 hours' unpaid work, fined £500 and made to pay costs of £562 with a victim surcharge of £85, at Willesden Magistrates Court.



PARTY'S OVER

People living in Orchard Grove, Edgware, can finally get a good night's sleep after we silenced the neighbour from hell.

Homeowner Clive Best
hosted drink and drug-fuelled
parties at all hours, where
fights and loud music rocked
the street. He shrugged off
warnings until police, along
with Harrow Council, took
Best to court and ordered
the property to close down
– meaning any visitors to the
house will risk arrest.

TRUANCY MUM TAGGED

A mum who let her child bunk off school for a year now has a criminal record. Harrow Council took the mum to court after she repeatedly kept her child off school without good reason and even turned down offers of help. The truancy was judged to be "Category 1" – the worst of its kind. The mum was given a curfew order, an electronic tag, a 12-month community order, and a £500 fine.

My Story



orman Shurrock is an inspiration, say his colleagues at Citizens Advice Harrow (CAH). He is the centre's longest-serving volunteer – clocking up 25 years this month – and is always welcoming, cheery and eager to help. And he's never had to call in sick.

Norman joined the awardwinning charity – which offers Harrow residents general information and advice about rights and responsibilities – when he was looking for something worthwhile to do in retirement, prompted by his wife Helen.

He says residents' issues are becoming "much more complex" but believes the service has adapted well. Help is delivered in person, by telephone and by email or webchat.

"It is a lot more structured now," he adds. "In the early days everything was paper-based and hardly computerised.

"The information system consisted of 30 volumes of paper files, which were continually updated manually and each file could only be accessed by one adviser at a time."

Citizens Advice, which started as a national emergency

'The information system consisted of 30 volumes of paper files, which were continually updated manually' wartime service in 1939, celebrates its own anniversary in September. Eighty years ago, the charity dealt with rationing, evacuees, permits, finding missing relatives and rehousing issues.

The first Harrow CAB – known as 007 as it was the 7th in the country – was in a former bar in Pinner. By 1945 there were two in the borough, looking after 83,000 enquiries.

Today, residents' top concerns are benefits and tax credits, debt, housing and employment. In 2017-18, the branch advised 11,731 clients on 13,619 issues. They estimate the value to society of their advice to be £14.2million.
