"I organised an exciting street party in Wealdstone with other mums in September. We had heard bad news about Wealdstone up to that point and we were fed up of hearing that. We wanted something fresh to bring the community spirit together. We were amazed at the results of the street party and the kindness of people. Local shops gave us



goody bags and Wenzel's in Wealdstone donated £1,000 worth of food, including sandwiches and children's lunch boxes. The party brought everyone together and now we're thinking about how else we can help in the future."

People didn't know what the police were doing locally and they wanted more information. Now, I'm pleased to say that we are working closely with residents, businesses and our Partners to tackle their anti-social behaviour concerns.

"For example, we are profiling the street drinkers in Wealdstone Square and referring them to agencies for help. We've met with local shops, businesses and churches, so they know what to report to us. They are pleased to be involved as it's bringing everyone together and shaping a safer community for all."

"I've been with Ignite Trust – a local charity in Wealdstone for five and a half years. My role involves engaging with hard to reach teenagers in the Wealdstone area, mostly boys, who have dropped out of school.

"We offer them activities such as a music project and boxing training instead of them loitering the streets or causing anti-social behaviour. We help them gain employment opportunities for young people and offer one to one sessions.

"We see their progress and potential - however, it can be tough. It's slow for some, whilst others really do transform their lives, which is fantastic."

"You hate fly-tips, we hate fly-tips too. I'm part of the crew that goes round the borough clearing up after people who illegally dump their waste.

"That's one part of what the council does - the other, is taking action to stop these criminals in the first place. In Wealdstone that includes putting in place a Public Space Protection Order for the alleyway behind Mir Supermarket - this basically gives us extra powers.

"In the past we've been limited with the action we can take, because it's not public land, now anyone caught dumping will be given a £100 fine or prosecuted. It's already having an impact."


YOUR COUNCILLOR
