"We're trying to change the High Street - so that every business here, no matter what size - is constantly striving towards a higher standard. Our aim is to make Wealdstone a more attractive place. Admittedly, this is a challenge!

"We've made many improvements to policing in Wealdstone and have been working well with our partners, including the council.

"Persistent drinkers are being cautioned, fined or arrested and improved police visibility has given local businesses the boost to turn drinkers away.

"Officers have also been working with Trading Standards - seizing fake goods including perfume and alcohol.

"All in all, we've made a lot of improvements to policing here and we're going to carry on working hard and being 'joined-up' with the council and all our partners."

WISH Centre
Wealdstone charity working to improve young people's lives

"I help young people who are self-harming, or have experienced abuse, neglect or bullying. I educate youngsters about online child sexual exploitation (CSE) and I work one-to-one with those who have been bullied online. One young person we helped who had been badly traumatised has recently gone on to Oxford University.

"The WISH team are small but close. We raise awareness about CSE in local schools. It's a demanding role and always changing. We also arrange trips for youngsters, regular talks and teach self defence classes. Staff are at the forefront of issues, locally and beyond. I love my job because my work is unique and I help people overcome barriers."



Harrow & Wealdstone station refurbishment

The council has been lobbying hard for improvements to be made to Harrow & Wealdstone station. It's a hugely valued local asset, but years of underinvestment have long been apparent.

Now Network Rail are poised to spend £3.8 million on this local transport hub, which each year witnesses close to 4 million passenger journeys.

Most of the work, which is due to complete in December, will take place on the footbridge, with the replacement of windows and flooring. They'll be a complete repaint and also improvements made to the station's stairways and lifts.


PUBLIC SPACE
