# **Describe Briefly The Nature Of The Proposed Variation**

Describe the premises. For example the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. The premises is a Football stadium situated in the centre of a 44 acre site. The site is bordered on one side by a Underground line on a raised hill and the other three sides are surrounded by other playing fields, so the location of the bars is nowhere near to any other residences.

The activities of the licensed area relate to alcoholic refreshments served during EFL football matches. All such events are stewarded by staff authorised by the SIA. All bars within the site are contained within buildings and fencing. No alcohol will be allowed off of the premises.

The full details of the proposed variation initiates from an EFL Regulated football match in EFL League Two between Barnet FC and Coventry City FC. This fixture takes place on 7th October 2017 and has resulted in the Kick Off moving forward to 12:30. On the date of this fixture it is now a 12:30 Kick Off due to being shown live on SKY SPORTS TV.

Our current licence conditions are a 12:00 start. The stadium would normally host 15:00 Kick Off fixtures and allow entry at 12:30 but as a result of this fixture change supporters will be allowed access to the stadium from 10:30. There is a possibility that Barnet FC may be picked for further live fixtures throughout the season and that therefore this is an example of why we require the variation in the licence.

Details of the proposed variation is therefore bringing the start time forward from 12:00 to 10:30 on Saturdays only. The extra timings will relate to inside the premises only. No extra music will be played and there will be no amplified music during the variation times.

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There are no variations to premises layout. There is no issues relating to access between the public part of the premises and the rest of the premises or the street or public way. The variation will have no effect that may block emergency exits or routes to emergency exits.

We take great pride in the service we offer both to our customers and to the efforts we make to help our neighbours
quality of life improve. By taking supporters off of the streets and into a restricted and neutral area with food and drink we
are ding our best to support the local policing plan and the local authorities alcohol plan. Detailed below we believe are the genuine reasons that this change can only benefit residents and the borough as a whole.
b) The prevention of crime and disorder
I suggest that by allowing the supporters into the stadium at an earlier time is likely to assist in the prevention of crime and disorder in that the prospect of fans with "cheap alcohol" from off licence premises hanging around the streets in the area
and indeed the complex is more likely to increase the prospect of anti social behavior whereas getting the fans inside and
away from local residents can only help in the reduction of the same.
c) Public safety
By taking supporters off of local streets and into the stadium where they can be "policed" by SIA qualified stewards this will have a positive effect on public safety across the area.

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d) The prevention of public nuisance

as per b) I equate the effect of anti-social behaviour in a similar fashion to that of crime and the effect that it has on peoples lives, As a club we do not want to see groups of males drinking in public areas and as a result of not being inside, urinating in the same areas where the public are. If fans are inside in an enjoyable environment they can eat and drink not to the detriment of the local neighbourhood

e) The protection of children from harm

It is also my submission that with fans inside the stadium and observed and "policed" by qualified stewards there is a substantial argument that we are assisting in the protection of children from harm.

In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

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- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
