Notes for Guidance

- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.

- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
- o evidence of the applicant's own identity .- such as a passport,
- evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g, a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
- evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
- (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
- (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
- (iii) studying e.g, letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
- (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an SI, S2 or S3 form.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

We may otherwise share information with the Home Office, Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
