Lower ground floor level is storage, office, kitchen and 1 x female and 1 x male toilets, ground floor is our main tea room and to the front of the premises is our cake display area and further seating. Further along the High Street, there are several restaurants with premises licenses: Incanto, The Connoisseur, Blues and Cafe We have traded as a daytime cafe for 11 years and we have no wish to create an evening operation if we are granted a premises license. Joanna Barrett-Miles (Personal License holder and DPS) and Katina Brum are co-founders and owners of The Doll's House on the Hill; we are in our 40s and one or both owners are on site 7 days a week. We wish to apply for a premises license for the retail sale of alcohol only. We do not wish to provide regulated entertainment or provide late night refreshments Over our 11 year history of trade, we have established ourselves as a top quality Afternoon Tea venue and lunch/teatime destination venue. We would like to serve Champagne Afternoon Tea's to patrons as we are finding that many patrons are asking for this service; the serving of champagne with Afternoon Tea is now quite the norm. We are looking to secure a premises license on the ground floor level of premises and small external private forecourt to front of premises for the retail sale by the glass only: champagne/English wine and beer We do not intend to sell whole bottles of wine/champagne. We will continue to promote an environment where non alcoholic drinks take precedence over alcoholic drinks. We will not seek to promote internally or externally the provision of alcohol. Our non alcoholic range is significantly larger than our		

alcoholic range which will feature 1 white wine, 1 champagne, 1 sparkling wine, 1 beer/larger. These alcoholic drinks will be offered by the glass only and as an accompaniment to an Afternoon tea experience or lunchtime meal. The alcoholic range will be significantly more expensive than the non-alcoholic range and will only be listed at the very back of the menu and

Our business model is that of an 'old fashioned English Tea Room' and alcohol consumption will be minimized by the fact that each reservation is offered 90 minutes only at the table. We anticipate that sales of alcohol will be infrequent but our business over the past 11 years has seen a huge rise in partakers of our Afternoon Tea service; guests' looking to celebrate often request "a glass of bubbly"; which currently we are unable to provide.

As a licensed premises, we know that it is necessary to carry out our systems and procedures and to operate our business with a purpose of promoting the 4 licensing objectives. We promise to support these objectives through our Operating Schedule and other measures including staff training/qualifications and stringent company policies.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Senior Management are on site 7 days week, closely monitoring all activities of customers and staff.

A clear and legible notice on the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises license during which licensable activities are permitted (Operating Schedule)

Not selling of alcohol to drunk or intoxicated customers.

Custom will not be sought by means of personal solicitation outside or in the vicinity of the premises.

Staff will be well trained in asking customers to use premises in an orderly and respectful manner

Sales of wine/beer by the glass will be monitored closely by management and no sales of bottles will be offered. Wine by the glass will be limited per person. We offer a strict 1 hr 30 minutes reservation slot on tables so guests will be unable to stay for longer consuming alcohol. Alcohol will be offered to guests enjoying lunch/afternoon tea only; sale of alcohol without a meal will not be offered.

We believe that the measures we have in place as detailed above will limit the possibilities of drunk or disorderly behavior on the premises and will eradicate any situations where violent or anti social behavior may occur

c) Public safety

Senior Management are on site 7 days week, closely monitoring all activities of customers and staff.

- 1)All parts of the premises and all fittings and apparatus therein, door fastenings and notices, lighting, heating, electrical, sanitary accommodation are well maintained at all times, in good order and in safe condition.
- 2) A log book will be kept upon the premises in which shall be entered particulars of inspections made; those required to be made by statute and information compiled to comply with any public safety condition attached to the premises license that requires the recording of such information. The log book shall be kept available for inspection when required by persons authorized by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation.
- 3) Fire fighting equipment/smoke detectors/emergency lighting maintained annually
- 4) Staff training re. evacuation procedure and all other heath & safety due diligence adhered to as outlined in the Company's Health & Safety handbook
- 5) First Aid trained staff on site

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Senior Management are on site 7 days week, closely monitoring all activities of customers and staff.

The Doll's House on the Hill operates during daytime hours only. Customers will not be admitted to the premises outside of 09:30 to 18:00

Loitering/smoking:

We have an external dining space within a very clear boundary which is enclosed by temporary canvas banners; this is a designated non-smoking area.

Guests' are served at the table both inside and out so customers are unable to loiter directly outside our premises', smoking.

Guests will be prohibited from taking glasses of wine from inside seating or within the external canvased seating area to smoke on the pavement.

Alcohol will only be sold to guests who have ordered lunch or Afternoon Tea

Alcohol will only be served to seated guests

Noise:

The ethos of the business which is essentially an old fashioned English tea room, promotes a "genteel" ambiance which is reflected in the background music - songs from the 1940's-60's. Public disturbance through noise is minimized owing to type of clientele at The Doll's House who are attracted to the 'homely and old fashioned' environment we promote.

e) The protection of children from harm

Senior Management are on site 7 days week, closely monitoring all activities of customers and staff.

The operating schedule will detail that the retail sale of alcohol is available during daytime hours only; children under 16yrs on the premises are generally accompanied by their family and we will ensure their protection by continuing to promote an environment where our non alcoholic drinks take precedence over our alcoholic ones.

We will ensure their protection by continuing to promote an environment where it is appropriate that alcohol in small volumes is consumed i.e. by the glass, to reduce the risk of inappropriate behavior.

Children aged 16-17yrs will not be served alcohol to accompany their meal; even permissible by a parent or guardian. We will operate a 'challenge 25' scheme and offer our staff training to ensure the effective operation of this and subsequent i.d. checks

We will have a "Challenge 25" sign to encourages anyone who is over 18 but looks under 25 to carry acceptable ID (a card bearing the PASS hologram, a photographic driving license or passport). If they wish to buy alcohol. We will also add this policy to our emailed Afternoon Tea booking confirmations.

Log book for refusals of sales will be kept upon the premises at all times.

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NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national
 of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement
 indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in
 the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National
 Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's
 parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's
 permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
 Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
 residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
 with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
 subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
 when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
 number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A
 (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
 with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
 reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
 decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one
 of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality:
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and

- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
