The premise is being operated in a way that undermines the public nuisance objective as the premise are causing a nuisance from persons leaving the premise who are not being properly controlled. People on leaving the building were allowed to congregate in Funky Brownz car par and on the public highway outside Funky Brownz. Noise levels were not being controlled as no door supervisors were outside moving people on as they left the building.

The public safety objective is being undermined as the recent visit raised concerns for the safety of the customers. Some CCTV cameras were not operational so certain areas had no coverage. Persons were able to enter the premise with no door checks as there were no door supervisors on the door the majority of the time.

Some people leaving the premise had clearly been drinking in excess and were very unsteady, with girls been carried to waiting vehicles. No door supervisors were seen checking this activity in the car park of the Funky Brownz.

Funky Brownz closed their doors in the early hours and for approximately the next 30 minutes there were no door supervisors outside.

Groups of people were allowed to congregate outside Funky Brownz without any door supervisors moving people on.

A fight started amongst the customers standing outside Funky Brownz with people going onto the main road around Belmont Circle roundabout, causing the traffic to stop and drive around the people in the road, again no door supervisors were seen.

The protection of children from harm objective is being undermined as a child was able to freely enter the premise at 02.05 AM. There were no door supervisors on the fire exit doors where the child entered and the child walked freely around the bar, in view of the bar staff. The child was seen inside the bar for approximately 10 minutes.

Premise Licence hours open to the public clearly breached. Premise should have closed at 02:00AM on Sunday as per the licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions breached:

- 8. No new patrons or customers to be admitted to the premises after 12 midnight on Thursdays and Sundays and on Fridays and Saturdays after 00:30 hours. Condition breached
- 11. A digital CCTV system shall be installed and maintained at the premises to meet the reasonable requirements of police within 28 days of such date when the premises licence is transferred to the premises licence holder. Conditon breached.

The premises did not have reasonable steps to check persons entering the premise especially in terms of age.

The actions of the persons connected to the premise were contrary to the reasonable behaviour that would be expected of those intent on preventing public nuisance and protecting customers.

A visit on the above premise on Sunday 19th February 2012, at 02:03AM found the premise open and accepting customers. The premise should have closed at 02:00AM.

At 02:03AM the double sided fire exit doors at the front of Funky Brownz (see attached Plan) were open onto the pavement closest to the shops on Belmont Circle. Both fire exit doors were wide open with people walking freely in and out of the premise. Many people were still visible drinking within the premise. People noise was clearly audible from our monitoring position 1 on Belmont Circle (marked on the attached Plan). This was noted as a breach of the Premise Licence Licensable hours and Annex 2(8) condition.

There were no staff on controlling access or egress at the open fire exit doors. At 02:05AM a young boy walked into the premise, via the open fire exit doors, unchecked. The young boy was aged approximately 9 to 11years old. He wandered freely within the bar area. Bar staff were still visible working behind the bar and people were still visible standing at the bar, sitting at tables and moving freely in and out of the premises via the open fire fire exit doors. People were standing and sitting on the public pavement outside the premise, smoking and talking.

At 02:10AM a man with three-quarters of a pint of lager was seen standing in the fire exit doorway. A girl was seen sitting at a table with a full glass of wine. A door supervisor approached the open fire exit doors, left them open and walked back into the bar. A member of staff in the first floor accommodation at the front of Funky Brownz appeared to notice us making notes in a car on Belmont Circle. A little bit later a member of staff could be heard calling out "can you start drinking up now" the time was noted as 02.11AM.

At 02:12AM people were still seen going in and out of the open fire exit doors with no supervisors on the door.

At 02.15AM the young boy came out the open fire exit doors and joined a group of 26 people now standing on the public pavement outside Funky Brownz. There was people noise from this group of people and from people leaving Funky Brownz via the main doors and standing in car park. The people noise was loud enough to cause nuisance to neighbours in residential properties on Belmont Circle and in nearby adjacent roads. There were no door supervisors controlling the situation or moving people on etc. People were seen fooling around outside the premises.

Finally at 02.18am a door supervisor appeared at the open fire exit doors and we changed monitoring position.

At 02.25AM approximately 50 people were still standing in the car park of Funky Brownz and on the public pavement outside Funky Brownz. A fight started up and moved onto the highway around the Belmont Circle roundabout. Cars on the highway had to stop or slow down to go round the people on the road. No door supervisors were seen. The fight subsided but people continued with drunken arguing and people noise, still there were no door supervisors outside Funky Brownz taking any action. The main doors of Funky Brownz were closed, a shadow of male inside the premise, appeared to be looking through the etched/frosted glass doors. The front doors opened to let a male and female inside the premise and the doors were closed again.

At 02.30am 33 people were still outside making noise.

At 02.35 am the remaining people were mainly congregated to the side of the car

park nearest the pavement. General drunken behaviour continued for example girls screaming, boys shouting across the road to friends, a girl screaming and being lifted into car. Still there were no door supervisors controlling behaviour and noise.

At 02.40am 26 people still remained in and around the car park of Funky Brownz, a girl who could hardly stand was seen falling into a bush and then being helped into a car by a male. No door supervisors were visible.

At 02.43AM I telephoned the telephone number on the premise licence and requested that the door supervisors come outside and move people on. A few moments later 3 males appeared and started to approach the groups of people and move them on and put them in taxis.

At 02.47AM The area was finally cleared. I telephoned the telephone number on the Premise Licence again to be told it was the Harlesden Branch, I was given the number for Belmont Circle Branch of Funky Brownz. I telephoned Belmont Circle Funky Brownz and spoke to the Manager I informed the Manager what we had witnessed and informed me he had CCTV to prove he had door supervisors outside which is contrary to what we had witnessed. I informed him we would be passing our findings to the Licensing team and we left the area.

The following week the Licensing team contacted Funky Brownz to obtain CCTV coverage. The management reported several cameras were not available (cameras 1, 5, 9 and 14) this left some internal areas of the bar and some external areas of the Funky Brownz with no CCTV coverage. The key camera number 14 used for coverage of the front external area outside the fire exit doors, the public pavement area, the public highway and part of the car park was not available even though the Manager had stated he had CCTV coverage.

OVERALL KEY POINTS


The visit highlighted the premise was operating beyond their permitted hours open to the public and breaching license conditions Annex 2(8) and Annex 2 (11).

Neither management nor door supervisors were upholding the licensing objectives 2.3 and 4.

Customers were allowed to drink to excess and the staff did not appear to assist customers to get home safely. The lack of controls and supervision presents a public safety risk. Intoxicated customers were seen to be lifted and put in vehicles by members of the public and some of these areas were later identified as not having CCTV coverage, presenting a risk to public safety.

The lack of door supervisors taking action inside and outside the premise presents a risk to public safety and public nuisance was witnessed.

The lack of checks on persons entering the premise for identification or age is of concern. Of particular concern with regard to the objective the protection of children from harm was the a young boy entering the premise after hours, when there were several customers intoxicated with alcohol and being allowed to walk freely around the bar for 10 minutes before he left the bar area.
