Its a small community pub with rear smoking area. Our original license allowed us to open at 10:00am and close at 23:00pm, however our customers and business have changed. We have a JD Witherspoon pub approx 400 yards from our pub and they open early in the morning selling food and drinks, which has had a serious affect on our business. We have no day trade whatsoever apart from the odd pensioner coming in. We propose to cater for our locals who tend to come out after work on a Friday and Saturday, who would like to stay a little longer in our pub and bring us in line with all our competitors namely Buckley's, Hennessy's and Witherspoons who all open till 1:00am or later.

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LICENSING OBJECTIVES

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

We run a nice clean friendly pub for local people and are very involved with the local community. We are constantly fundraising for local school, football teams and other charities. Last year we raised over £25,000 and this year we hope to beat that total.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

We are increasing our CCTV recording from 28 days to 31 days. We vigorously check any persons entering the premises to insure that they are of the legal age to drink and all staff are on the look out for proxy alcohol sales. We strictly endorse challenge 25s policy. We are a member of pub watch and regular attend meetings. We have a refusal to serve book in which all incidents are logged. Both Gents and Ladies toilets are checked regularly (every 2 hours) and any person/persons suspected of drug activity will be asked to leave the premises immediately and report to the metropolitan police, we log all incidents in our incident report book. If we are successful in our application we propose to have a policy of non admittance after 12:00 pm.

c) Public safety

We have 7 cameras in operation which we are updating from 28 days recording to 31 days. All our fire extinguishers are check annually and are in good working order. All our fire exits are clearly marked. All hazardous substances are are locked away safety. All our electrical appliances are checked annually and full comply. We have a fire plan in place and all our staff are briefed on best practices in the event of an emergency. We have also trained our staff on what to do in the event terrorism attack. We have also trained out staff in the best way to deal with aggressive customers and to watch out for strange customers i.e someone who is under the influence of medication or drugs (someone that just doesn't seem right).

d) The prevention of public nuisance

We have signage at the front and rear of pub requesting patrons to leave the premises quietly and respect all neighbors. We have 183 bus close to pub which runs all night Friday and Saturday, we keep a timetable behind the bar for patrons, along with all local mini cab numbers. We have forged a good relationship with all our neighbors and we inform them when we are having an fundraising events and/or party's. We have once again produced a leaflet with relevant phone

numbers and emails, if anyone would like to contact us regarding any issues that may emanate from the pub. We propose to limit the number of people in the outside smoking area to 10 after 11:00pm to ensure that noise levels are kept to a minimum. We also to propose to turn off outside background music and TV by 11:00pm. No rubbish will be put in bins in the yard after 11:00pm. Before leaving the premises we encourage people to pre book a cab or check time for bus in order to prevent people hanging around on the street outside.

e) The protection of children from harm

All Children must be accompanied by an adult and kept under supervision at all times. Any person under 18 will be ask to leave the premises by 19:00, We have signs in place to outline this. All our staff are trained to check for the correct identity card such as pass scheme card and also vigilant to look out for proxy sales. We keep a record in our refusal to serve book.

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NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided 0 by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the 0 entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or o on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling 0 circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
