Due regard has been given to the Licensing Act 2003, the revised guidance set out at section 182 (LA2003) Harrow Councils Licensing Policy, and general best practice and guidance from the industry and government.

For ease of reference conditions applicable to sections b - e have all been shown in this section:

- 1. All staff involved in the sale or supply of alcohol shall receive regular training on current "Best Practice" and their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003. Records of the training will be kept in a retrievable format and made available for inspection without undue delay to the Police and authorised officers of the London Borough of Harrow.
- 2. All windows and doors will be kept closed (except for entry and exit) at all times when regulated entertainment takes place.
- 3. As per the Mandatory Conditions The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) (Amendment) Order 2014. The age verification policy adopted by the premises will be in line with the current "best practice" recommended by the Police and Licensing Authority.
- 4. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at the entrance/exit requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents by leaving the premises and the local area without causing any undue disturbance.
- 5. All bookings for pre booked functions will recorded in either a hard copy written format or electronically and be readily available for inspection without undue delay, following any reasonable request made by the Police or authorised officers from the London Borough of Harrow. The record must contain the full name, date of birth, home address, and contact telephone number of the person booking the event, the nature of the event/celebration and the number of people attending.
- 6. The premises will be set out with sufficient tables and chairs to seat 120 people at all times, with the exception of pre booked functions. Note: The maximum capacity for the premises is covered by the fire regulatory reforms act and contained within the fire risk assessment document.
- 7. When SIA door staff are deployed their full name, SIA badge number and the name of the company they are employed by will be recorded in a specific log together with the date and hours they are working. This will be produced by the premises licence holder or their agent, without undue delay, following any reasonable request made by the Police or authorised officers from the London Borough of Harrow
- 8. All Door Supervisors employed at the entrance/exit of the premises will wear high visibility clothing
- 9. An incident and refusals log will be kept at the premises and fully maintained to record adequate information detailing any significant incidents and persons refused alcohol. This will include time and date, brief details of the incident, people involved and action taken. This will be signed by the person making the entry and the logs will regularly be checked and countersigned by the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 10. Any external smoking area provided for customers will be monitored and controlled by the staff to ensure that the licensing objectives are fully promoted
- 11. After 22:00hrs all persons under 16 years of age must be accompanied by an adult of 18 years of age or over
- 12. A digital recording CCTV system will be installed and fully maintained to comply with the following:
- a) All cameras will be capable of recording images of a quality sufficiently high to identify individuals

b) At least one camera will be installed at any of the entrances and must be capable of taking a higher quality "head and shoulder" image of every person entering the premises c) Images will be retained for a minimum of 28 days before being overwritten
d) The images will be stored in a format that is easily retrievable. Copies will be provided without undue delay, and in accordance with the data protection act, following any reasonable request from the Police or authorised officers of the London Borough of Harrow
e) At all times when the premises are open for licensable activity, at least one person will be able to operate the CCTV system and allow images to be viewed by the Police, or authorised officers of the London Borough of Harrow, in the lawful execution of their duty
f) If for any reason the CCTV system malfunctions this information will communicated without any undue delay in a format agreed by the Police and London Borough of Harrow Licensing
13. No rubbish, including glass or bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in any outside areas between 23:00 hours and 08:00 hours

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A **full** birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's parents or adoptive parents, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.

- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
 with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
 reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
 decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
