8. Once you have completed this form, please either email or send the form to the address below. We will inform you if your application has been granted.
9. **All forms must be received by this office no later than 5pm Tuesday 26 November 2019.**
10. **Postal packs will be sent out around Thursday 21 November 2019.** If you are likely to be away from your registered address, you may wish to give an alternative address for the ballot paper to be sent to, as in Note 3. **Alternatively, you may wish to appoint a proxy (someone to vote on your behalf).** Further details may be found on this website.
11. **Please note:** If you have been granted a postal vote you cannot vote in person at the polling station.
12. Postal votes can be cancelled in writing up to **5pm on Tuesday 26 November 2019.**

Your personal identifiers will be stored securely. **When you vote by post, your signature and date of birth provided on the postal voting statement will be checked against these identifiers.** This is to ensure your postal vote remains secure.
