Debate Mate Online

In response to the pandemic, <u>Debate Mate</u> this year moved online. A popular enrichment activity for our young people and this year attracted even more students from KS3 to KS5 from Harrow, Barnet, Brent and Ealing Virtual Schools. 14 young people attended the five afterschool sessions and then entered the competition on the first Saturday of half term.

Oral feedback from the participants was very positive and the majority said that they would like to do more debating sessions. They enjoyed the Wednesday sessions and the Saturday competition, saying that they felt they had improved their powers of argument and will continue to use the skills they learned in their daily lives. Many also said they now had more confidence in 'speaking out'.

One young person said they enjoyed debating itself and meeting others whilst another really enjoyed rebuttal.

All 14 young people received a participation certificate and winners' certificates were sent to the 3 winners.

HVS Video Conferencing Forums

Sara Dawson and Michelle Tyson have begun hosting termly online forums for schools to provide additional support and further training.

Previous forums have focussed on tackling some of the difficulties posed by Covid-19 on both students and staff, and using formulation to help get into the heads of our looked after young people and to help us provide tailored, targeted, and effective support.

The date for the next forum is Thursday 13th May.

Carer Forums

Sara Dawson, and Clare Sullivan from Harrow's Family Placement Service, have also continued to run fortnightly online forums for Foster Carers, which have now moved to Tuesdays.

Each forum focusses on a different topic presented by Sara, and also provides opportunities to connect with other carers and share their experiences and knowledge.

Previous forums have covered a range of topics including attachment, placement endings, teen anxiety, sibling rivalry, depression in young people, mindfulness, identity, and the power of play.

The feedback received from the carers has been very positive.

MEET OUR PARTNERS

Newton Farm Nursery, Infant and Junior School, Harrow

Anu Jain was delighted to be able to catch- up with the Headteacher of Newton Farm School, Matt Bradley, earlier this term.

Colleagues who attended our 'Achieving Excellence Together' Training last December, may recognise Matt as he spoke about the work his school does to support looked after and previously looked after children. Matt started out as a teacher at Newton Farm having originally worked in the City. He subsequently returned from a Deputy Headship at St Luke's School to take the Headteacher position at Newton Farm. He has also been a Governor of a Special School and an elected Councillor in Brent.

All vulnerable groups are offered to join the 'Mighty Minds Group' which is based on the <u>3 pillars of</u> <u>Newton Farm</u> (Growth Mindset, Philosophy for Children and Rights Respecting). You can watch their video via the hyperlink above.

Children who are deemed vulnerable are also given the opportunity to attend 'Extensive Challenge' sessions where they are able to 'tap 'into unlocking their potential.

Newton Farm also runs 1:1 tuition, therapies with specialists and a Forest School Programme.

Safeguarding Strategy Meetings are held weekly for every vulnerable child. In addition to this, termly pupil progress meetings are also held with parents or carers, school staff and social workers.

With 2.5% of their pupil population being a child looked-after or previously looked after, Newton Farm is also a Trauma Aware School.

Thank you to Matt, for taking the time to share how his school supports vulnerable groups.
