ADVANCE INFORMATION: Temporary Road Closures and Suspended Bays at Eastcote Road and Valentine Road

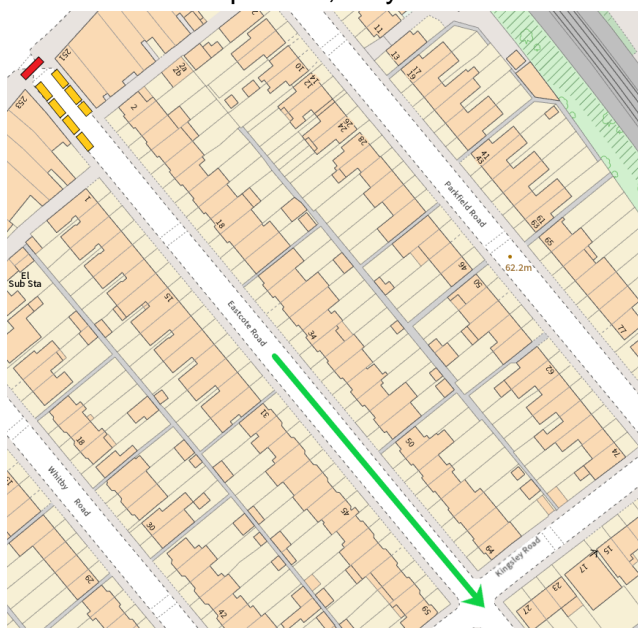
As part of the Council’s High Street Fund Project to improve South Harrow, I am writing to inform you that two Copenhagen Crossings have been planned along Eastcote Road and Valentine Road. This will result in temporary road closures to Eastcote Road and suspension of some parking bays on each site.




Copenhagen Crossings are blended pedestrian crossings from one side of a footway to the opposite side. It is designed to give greater access and priority to pedestrians at side roads and reduces the speed of vehicles entering and exiting these pedestrian areas.

The temporary road closures and suspension of some bays are necessary to build the Copenhagen crossings. Local signage will be displayed at each location to highlight the dates and details of the suspended bays. To minimise disruption, works will take place at one location at a time at the dates set out below.

Copenhagen Crossing 1 – Eastcote Road

Improvement works and the road closure starts 14th February 2022 until 28th February 2022. The exit from Eastcote Road onto Northolt Road will be temporarily closed to enable the works to progress. The one-way system will also be temporarily reversed to allow exit onto Kingsley Road. Residents and visitors will be able to continue to access Eastcote Road and park on it. However, seven parking bays on Eastcote Road near the junction of Northolt Road will be suspended, they will be available again on completion of the works.

Copenhagen Crossing 2 – Valentine Road

The improvement works and partial road closure will take place at the junction of Valentine Road with Northolt Road from 28th February 2022 until 21st March 2022. The works to the junction of Valentine Road will be completed in a phased approach – one half of the road at a time. This will enable vehicles to access Valentine Road during the works.

To enable the works, three bays will be suspended on Valentine Road up to Ash Tree Clinic building. In addition, three bays on the side of the pub, and two bays on the opposite side, on the service road will be suspended. This will allow a temporary entrance to be created for access onto the service road to enable parking in the rest of the bays. The temporary entrance will be removed after the Copenhagen crossing is complete.



These works are part of the Council's High Street Fund project to support local district centres by delivering improvements that will refresh the area creating a vibrant, safer and more pleasant environment for all.
