2.0-The existing premise licence and this application for a new licence The premise already benefits from an existing premises licence LN/000013452 granted in 2019 (in place of an earlier licence) which currently permits the provision of late-night refreshment from the restaurant from 23:00 until 00:00 for 7 days a week and from the drive thru until 00:00 Sunday to Thursday and 02:00 on Friday and Saturday. This is a new application for a premises licence to protect the existing and if granted in favourable terms re the conditions and timings detailed in this application then the applicant shall consider surrender of licence LN/000013452.
3.0 -Proposal This is a new application for:
(i) Late night refreshment from 23:00 until 00:00 Monday to Sundays inclusive for the restaurant and 23:00 until 02:00 Mondays to Sundays inclusive for the drive thru and McDelivery operation/s. (ii) The application proposes one seasonal variation. Late night refreshment to be permitted from the end of licensable activity up until 05:00 on the morning of New Years Day.
4.0 - Conditions proposed under the operating schedule These are set out in Part M of this application but replicate the majority of those conditions under annex 2 of the existing premises licence except the condition relating to barriers which are sought to be replaced by ANPR technology to limit the amount of time a customer can remain on site.
5.0- Pre application enquiry 5.1 - The applicant Kylu Limited via their licensing agent and in conjunction with the Secretary of States Revised Guidance December 2022 issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 have carefully considered and acted on advice in sections 8.42 and 8.46 of the guidance and consulted with the Metropolitan police and Harrow Council licensing authority as two of the main responsible authorities. This has assisted the applicant and those authorities (pre application) to identify and understand any relevant issues in the local area of Shaftesbury Circle as well as any risks to the local area from the opening times for the restaurant and drive thru facility relevant to the licensing objectives concerned with crime and disorder and public nuisance.
5.2 - The findings of the pre application enquiry with the named responsible authorities have established that the premise already operate the drive thru facility on Friday and Sat and until 02:00 without major issues of crime and disorder or public nuisance issues. Licence control measures in this application with the exception of car park barriers (that are to be replaced with ANPR) have been replicated from the operating schedule of the current premise licence. The pre application enquiry has assessed these conditions should be adequate in supporting the provision of late night refreshment from the in-store restaurant and drive thru and McDelivery facilities.

- b) The prevention of crime and disorder
- 1. The head unit (recorder) for storing CCTV images must be located in a secure cabinet or other secure area out of the sight and reach of the public.
- 2. The CCTV system to be maintained and operated in good order and to the satisfaction of the Metropolitan Police reasonable requests. The medium upon which the images are recorded will be clearly identifiable, stored securely and retained for a period of not less than 31 days. Footage and screenshots shall be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority Officers immediately upon request in accordance with the Data Protection Act 2018.
- 3. Such footage must be provided in an immediately viewable format and must include any software etc. which is required to view the footage. Any discs, portable drives or other storage media onto which the footage is transferred must be provided by the Premises.
- 4. A member of staff who is trained to operate the system and supply the footage must be present at the Premises at all times when licensable activities are taking place.
- 5. Signage shall be displayed throughout the restaurant and drive thru facility warning that CCTV is in operation for the detection and prevention of crime and disorder.
- 6. Delivery drivers shall not be allowed to wait outside the front of the restaurant after 23:00 and any that do will be reported to Uber and prevented from collecting takeaway orders.
- c) Public safety
- 7. The car park shall be monitored by an ANPR (automatic number plate recognition) system that shall restrict the amount of time a customer can remain in the car park. Prominent signage shall be displayed to advertise ANPR is in operation.
- 8. There shall be a fully trained manager deployed at the premises between 23:00 and the terminal hour.
- d) The prevention of public nuisance
- 9. Signage shall be displayed throughout the drive thru requesting customers to respect local residents (i) not to use their horns, (ii) play loud music, (iii) and to leave the premises quietly.
- 10. Delivery drivers shall not be permitted to park on the public highway in front of the Premises. This will be enforced by the manager on duty.

- 11. Clear, illuminated signage that informs persons that the alfresco area (shown on plan 0912-1005-300-D) is out of bounds between the hours of 23:00 and
- 05:00 shall be prominently displayed in this area. Where persons are seen to be disregarding these notices and/or loitering outside the Premises, the manager on duty shall challenge and politely ask those persons to leave the Premises.
- 12. Prominent and clear signage shall be displayed throughout the drive thru to warn customers to keep noise to a minimum, respect the needs of local residents, leave the Premises and the area quietly and not to:
- (i) Use their vehicle horns;
- (ii) Play loud music;
- (iii) Rev engines or act in anti social manner
- Or they may risk not being served. Signage shall also warn customers that these types of antisocial behaviour are recorded on CCTV which will be used to identify offenders and reported to Harrow Council and/or the Police.
- 13. A telephone number and e-mail address will be made available to residents (via signage displayed at the Premises) to enable residents to contact the Premises to report evidence of anti-social behaviour within or on the boundary of the Premises.
- 14. The placing of waste, including bottles, into receptacles outside the Premises shall only take place between the hours of 07:00 and 23:00 to minimise disturbance to nearby properties.
- 15. Litter patrols shall be extended to cover those hours when the drive thru is open up until 02:00. Litter patrols shall be extended up to a 100 metre radius of the Premises and all of the Shaftesbury Circle. All litter shall be properly bagged and disposed of in a commercial litter receptacle.

e) The protection of children from harm

No conditions are offered under this licensing objective as none were raised in the applicants risk assessment for late night refreshment however the applicant would consider conditions if they are required by the responsible authorities or interested parties subject to those conditions being relevant and proportionate to this application.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A **full** birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's parents or adoptive parents, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.

- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
 with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
 subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
 when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
 number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
 with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
 reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
 decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.


