I hope, however you celebrate, that you're looking forward to catching up with loved ones and taking a well earned break.

Looking back on 2023, I'm proud of the things we've achieved for residents. Our programme of road and pavement resurfacing is starting to make a real difference, with more than 50 completely renewed and looking superb.

We'll confirm our resurfacing programme for 2024 shortly. This will bring more of our roads and pavements up to this high standard. There's a lot of work ahead here and many more still need attention.

Other things achieved in 2023 of which I'm proud, include the completion of phase 1 of the Grange Farm development, onehour free parking, our new tennis courts and new street signs. We're starting to change our borough for the better, though again a lot of work remains.

Future high streets start taking shape

We are coming to the end of a six-week public consultation on our proposed improvements to Harrow town centre.

We've received funding – £7.1 million through the Government's Future High Streets Fund and £1.1 million of our own borough funds from the Community Infrastructure Levy scheme - to improve Greenhill Way, Kymberley Road, Clarendon Road, College Road, the Pinner Road and Greenhill Way pedestrian underpass and Station Road.

Construction is due to start in mid-2024.

Green doctor in the house

Energy experts visit homes to lower energy costs

ou don't really hear of doctors doing house calls these days, but the Green Doctor is different. And rather than curing coughs and sneezes, this doctor is interested in draughts and breezes.

It's all part of a free service, managed by Groundwork London, which offers advice and practical help to make homes more energy efficient.

> They have already helped 17 Harrow households with energy advice and vouchers.

> > "It is so important right now that people can cess energy

grants and advice," says Daniel Brittle, the Green Doctor's service manager. "Every day I hear good news stories of someone we've helped and we are excited about bringing that same enthusiasm to Harrow".

Harrow residents can get advice online and over the phone, or arrange an in-person house calls from a qualified energy advisor.

Support with the cost of living

If you're struggling to manage your bills and household finances, support is available through the government's Household Support Fund (HSF), of which Harrow received £3 million. There's advice and support available, whatever your circumstances, to help keep you warm and well this winter.

More than 6,000 eligible children in Harrow will again receive vouchers to help with the cost of food during the school holidays.

We're contacting **care** leavers and qualifying households receiving Housing Benefit to provide supermarket vouchers. These can be used to buy food and other essential items. Our government grant is also supporting Help Harrow, which helps residents access food, and advice on topics like energy, health,

wellbeing and benefits.

We're also funding an application scheme for £200 supermarket vouchers for qualifying residents. Visit harrow.gov.uk/ householdsupportfund to check if you are eligible.

Spreading the Joy

ur children's centres provide a great programme of free activities focused on fun, child development and support. We visited Cedars Early Support Hub and found happy toddlers enjoying a play session.

Sjed regularly brings his twoyear-old son here. He told us it offers a safe and welcoming environment and helps his son, also called Sjed, to socialise with other toddlers.

Across the corridor, children with



a variety of needs, enjoyed the sounds, lights and colours in the centre's sensory room.

Cedars is one of 9 locations offering play sessions, weaning parties, teeth-brushing advice, speech and language support, help to transition to school and more.

The Wealdstone Centre is dedicated to services for children aged 9 to 19, and up to 25 for young adults with disabilities.

You can find it all on the Joy App - it's packed with information and includes a translation function for more than 100 languages.

Mark Scanlon, the council's Assistant Director for Youth Justice and Early Help, said, "Parenting can be hard, whatever your circumstances - but help is here, it's local and it's free.

Our ambition is to get to a place where there's 'no wrong front door'"



"There's a lot available for parents and kids - from the council, NHS and others. We want to bring it together and make it easier to access - so next we plan to put these services in other places, like our warm hubs.

We're seeing many parents of young children going to A&E

- not because their child is seriously ill, but because they're not sure where else to go.

"Our ambition is to get to a place where there's 'no wrong front door' – so there's a way for parents to access what they need, wherever they go in the community."

Restoring pride

nother successful 'Week of Action', saw the council, police and fire brigade coordinating efforts to improve standards of safety and cleanliness in the Rayners Lane area.

14 fines were issued during the week for offences including littering, spitting and street-drinking. Police colleagues made two arrests, one for burglary.

Our trading standards team made unannounced visits to businesses along Alexandra Avenue and Rayners Lane. They issued 5 notices for waste management offences and cautioned one business owner over the sale of



This severely overcrowded house of multiple occupancy is being investigated controlled items, including tobacco and fireworks.

Another business we came across was unregistered and operating without electricity. The premises were dirty and raised numerous health and safety concerns. Other premises visited during the



week will receive follow up inspections to ensure ongoing compliance with the law.

Most concerning was the discovery of an unlicensed house of multiple occupation with severe overcrowding. Our officers believe at least 10 adults and three children were living in the three-bedroom flat, sharing one bathroom and a tiny kitchen. Problems with the electrics, including exposed wires, also posed a serious fire risk. The council is taking further action with the landlord and supporting the families affected.

Further weeks of action will follow in the new year.



Room with a view

e're getting tough on fly-tippers with new mobile cameras focused at hot spots, all under the watchful eye of our new CCTV room.

Where there is evidence, offenders face fines of £400 for dumping rubbish. Images captured by the new cameras are also being used in witness appeals to help catch more offenders.

Police and Council data have identified fly-tip hot spots as well as reports from residents and neighbourhood watch groups.

Park Way

The cameras will stay in place for as long as necessary to bring down fly-tipping and will be moved to new locations as needed.

Footage will be reviewed at our brand new control room when a fly-tip occurs and investigated.

Homeless help

Firm ground for homeless

hile most of us are focusing on festivities, the annual Harrow Street Count shows a different side of the season as we get a snapshot of the borough's rough sleeper population.

Every year local authorities take to the streets to provide a figure for how many people are sleeping rough on a typical night. The information is used to collate national statistics on homelessness.

The team meet at the offices of Harrow homeless organisation Firm Foundation. CEO Julian Sanders, who leads the street count, says: "Homelessness is increasing. In 2009 the official number of rough sleepers in Harrow was 6. The latest figure is 96, but we know it's likely to be a lot more because these are only the people verified."

The foundation runs day services for homeless people three days a week. "People can come for food or a shower, get a haircut, but that's not what we're about.

"That side is important but the main reason people come here is to connect with us so we can work with them to end homelessness," Julian says.

Firm Foundation also run Harrow's winter night shelter from 1 January to the end of

"Once people are through the door we can allocate a case worker to arrange a support package that's tailored to their needs," Julian says. "That might be around budgeting, mental health, offending or drug and alcohol problems.

"It's really the engagement that we're about, getting people to the point where they can manage themselves. And we're good at what we do – we house someone every fortnight."

This year 180 people have used

their day services, of which 86 identify themselves as rough sleepers. There are other ways someone might be homeless. Some are in temporary accommodation, staying with friends, or 'sofa surfing'.

"If someone has been given an eviction notice they're considered homeless and we can step in and work with them," Julian adds. "We're looking to expand our drop-in and move to a full day service to help meet this increasing demand. We don't receive any statutory funding so donations and volunteers are always welcome."
