Landlines in the UK are going digital.


Are you ready?

The UK's landlines are getting an upgrade and soon most phone calls will be made over a broadband line. Don't worry, your landline is here to stay. Your phone number won't change, and over 99% of handsets work with the new system.

For most customers, the move to Digital Voice, BT's new home phone service is as simple as plugging your phone into a router rather than the phone socket on the wall.

elcome to the Spring issue of Harrow People. This year marks a major milestone - the 60th anniversary of the London Borough of Harrow.

Since 1965, our borough has grown and evolved. I know from speaking to residents that, while they have seen improvements in their neighbourhoods over the last few years, there is still much more work to be done to restore pride in Harrow.

Back in 2023, we set out bold plans to improve our boroughinvesting in cleaner streets, safer neighbourhoods, better roads, and easier access to services, particularly for people most in need.

As we enter the final year of our corporate plan, we reflect on what's been achieved over the past year and set out our 30 flagship projects for the months ahead. See inside for details.

At the same time as restoring pride in Harrow, we remain on a stable financial footing. As this issue went to print, we agreed a balanced budget. And we're investing heavily on services that

matter to you - £900,000 into street cleansing, £6m into our parks over three years and £42m over three years to improve our roads and pavements. See page 7 for details.

We are opening a one-stop shop on Gavton Road for residents to access council services face to face, and reopening our phone lines for general enquiries.

Finally, we are progressing on building for the future. I am pleased that a planning application is in for the old Civic Centre, called Poets Corner, for 1,000 new homes and green spaces. Plus, work will start later this year on 149 homes near Harrow Leisure Centre, many of them family houses.

All these developments will include new council homes and homes that are genuinely affordable.

HAF activities **back for Easter**


The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme for children has cracked open a free timetable of boredombusting fun for the Easter break.

We've officially launched our new Family Hubs network, transforming children's centres into more than just places to play and learn.

The Hubs bring together children's, health, and maternity services alongside voluntary organisations in key locations across Harrow, ensuring families get the right support at the right time and in the right place.

Services include talk and play, family rooms, health visiting, maternity support, parenting support, and health and wellbeing sessions.

There are also checks on 2-year-olds, weaning groups, fathers' groups, speech and language advice, cooking classes and sensory rooms for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities.


Brazen fly-tippers caught on camera

Fly-tippers who thought they could dump their waste without being seen, have instead got their faces on to our wall of shame.

More than 30 cameras fitted in hot spots around the borough are helping us find and fine fly-tippers.

In the last two months, CCTV helped us trace five fly-tippers who have paid a price for their crime with fines totalling more than £5,000 issued and paid.

Celebrating **60 Years**

n 1965, The Who performed at Churchill Hall, the Kodak factory in Wealdstone was a major employer, and new semi-detached and terraced homes were being built in Harrow.

We're proud of where we've come from and who we are now. The London Borough of Harrow is 60 this year and we're celebrating. A lot has changed since it became a 'London borough'.

From May until September, there will be a programme of events to commemorate our history, identity, and vibrant community.

Starting off festivities is Headstone Manor & Museum, with a digital exhibition showcasing archival photographs of Harrow alongside modern images of the same locations, captured by a Harrow-based photographer and local young people.

Other events planned include cultural exhibitions, performances, heritage projects, and community-led initiatives, offering an opportunity for all to get involved.

veryone wants clean and safe streets. This vear we're committed to £900,000 investment in street cleansing and £6m into our parks, alongside days and nights of action – all part of our flagship actions.

Our recent day of action in Lowlands Rec saw us working with partner agencies to engage with the community on local issues and antisocial behaviour.

We're working closely with local and volunteer groups who play a huge role in this. Groups like Harrow Litter Pickers, who joined us at a number of Days of Action. We've provided them with bags and litter pickers and share the



same vision – restoring pride back into our streets.

Their story is incredible. In 2024, the thousand-strong army of volunteers have collected 17,508 bags of rubbish.

Alongside 140 group events and 1,469 litter-picks, they've also assisted with 276 witness statements to help us find and fine fly-tippers.

The group are carrying out nine clear up events as part of the Great British Spring Clean. Were proud to support the national event led by Keep Britain Tidy which aims to help people take care of their local areas. Some of these have already taken place



but there are clean up events taking place until 6 April. Join one local to you.

Another resident restoring pride in her neighbourhood is Kanchan Chauhan, pictured bottom left. The Harrow's Heroes finalist led a project to transform a fly-tipped alleyway in Rayners Lane into a beautiful community garden.

e are making significant strides in our commitment to regenerating and transforming council-owned sites into thriving communities, ensuring that residents have access to high-quality and genuinely affordable homes.

We have approved plans to deliver 149 new family homes, including 71 three-bedroom houses, at Byron Quarter, a long-disused council site adjacent to Harrow Leisure Centre. This development will provide a mix of council homes, shared ownership properties, and private market housing—helping more local families find secure, high-quality accommodation.

At the heart of the development, residents will enjoy a new green space featuring seating areas, play spaces, and walking and cycling links to the Belmont Trail and Byron Park.



Grange Farm Estate

In South Harrow, we continue to make good progress on the regeneration of the Grange Farm estate. Following recent consultation, Phase 2a planning application is soon to be submitted.

This phase of the redevelopment will deliver 50 new homes. Of these, 36 will be council homes for existing tenants, with the remaining homes likely available under the London Living Rent scheme, ensuring affordability for local families.

The regeneration of the whole estate will ultimately create around 500 modern homes alongside a new community centre and improved public spaces. Artist's impression of Byron Quarter

Poets' Corner

A stone's throw from Harrow & Wealdstone station, we're creating a new neighbourhood and generous areas of new public space for local people. On the old council offices site we, in partnership with Wates, will build 1,000 new homes, some of which will be council homes, over the next 10 years. A planning application has been submitted, and it is still open for you to have your say.


