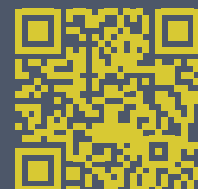

Local Plan in final stages of approval

A three-week hearing into our draft Local Plan, which will guide all planning decisions in Harrow for the next 16 years, began on 24 June.

Known as an Examination in Public, the hearing is being led by a government-appointed planning inspector, who is reviewing all representations and assessing the plan's soundness and legal compliance.

Our draft Local Plan sets out our vision for the borough's future ensuring development meets the needs of our community while protecting the character of our suburbs.

This is the final stage in the process, following consultations with residents and businesses, as well as our submission of the final draft to the Secretary of State earlier this year.

Once the inspector shares their findings, we'll review them and make necessary changes. We hope to approve the plan by the end of the year.

We are proud of the rich history and architecture in our borough. Following public consultation last year, we introduced two Local Areas of Special Character (LASC) in parts of West Harrow and Pinner. This is a special status to protect these unique areas that residents cherish.

Following suggestions from previous consultations, we have identified two potential LASCs in West End

Lane, Pinner, and Kenton Park Parade, and a small extension of the existing West Harrow LASC.

Cllr Marilyn Ashton, Cabinet Member for Planning and Regeneration, said: "People care deeply about the character of our historic streets and buildings. We encourage all residents to have their say."

Park and ride: Bike hub rolling into Lowlands



Say goodbye to juggling padlocks or searching for a safe place to leave your bike. The borough's first cycle hub is coming soon to Lowlands.

We partnered with parking specialists Spokesafe to deliver the hub, which features 37 secure bike spaces, including room for cargo bikes, non-standard cycles, and e-bike charging stations.

The 24/7 facility will be bookable in advance via Spokesafe's app, making daily rides that much easier.

It's our practical step towards increasing sustainable travel and supporting Harrow's growing cycling community.

Charging up Harrow

It's electrifying news for electric or hybrid car drivers. We've teamed up with Trojan Energy to install 100 new EV chargers on streets across Harrow, with more planned later in the year. Easy, affordable and convenient – 69 charging points have already been installed in locations selected using specific criteria.

These charging points are hidden when not in use, provide fast charging and there's no need for an app or card – just plug in with your personal adaptor.

The project is supported by funding from the government's On-Street Residential Chargepoint Scheme and is due to be completed this year.

Meet the new Mayor

'Kindness, caring and respect' is the theme for Harrow's new mayor.

Cllr Anjana Patel took up the chains of office in May and says she is looking forward to meeting as many people, and community and faith groups, as possible throughout her mayoral year.

"As Deputy Mayor, I met many residents and organisations who do amazing things in Harrow," the new mayor said. "I am proud to serve a diverse and vibrant borough."

Cllr Patel becomes Harrow's 73rd mayor, and the UK's first British Tanzanian/Indian born mayor.

She has lived in Harrow for 25 years and has served as a councillor twice since 2002. She has been representing Belmont ward since 2018. Cllr Patel has served as a Cabinet Member for community and culture, schools and children's development, and most recently for environment and community safety. In keeping with

her mayoral theme, the new Mayor has chosen v-i-a and the Samaritans as her charities for the year. "I encourage everyone to support my charities, who carry out vital work to help those most in need," she said.

"This year is a special year as Harrow marks its diamond jubilee, and I look forward to celebrating 60 years of our history, culture and heritage.

"I would like to thank the outgoing mayor, Cllr Salim Chowdhury who I have been supporting with a number of engagements when I was Deputy Mayor. I look forward to building on his legacy to bring people together and meeting many of our residents and community groups over the next year."

During the Mayor making ceremony in May, Rupesh Patel was appointed Consort to the Mayor.

Meet our enforcement team

We've boosted our enforcement team to tackle fly-tippers head-on! Fines are now £1,000, and our Wall of Shame is making a difference.

Last year, we issued over 1,200 fines.

We're also dealing with abandoned vehicles and enforcing public space rules (known as Public Space Protection Orders or PSPOs). But it's not just about penalties. Our Enforcement Team are here to help residents and businesses keep Harrow clean, giving advice on how to dispose of waste properly and where waste goes – the bin, the recycling centre or even one of our new Drop and Go recycling events.

This is one of 30 Flagship Actions to restore pride in Harrow and make our streets clean and safe. Our team speaks many languages, so we can connect with everyone on environmental issues.

Drop and Go



Go with the throw

We're bringing the recycling centre to your doorstep! Our Drop and Go events take bulky waste collection trucks into communities. People can get rid of the things that won't fit in their household bins. This includes things like textiles, old furniture and small electrical items. And the best part – it's for free!

Our first Drop and Go event was a huge success. Hundreds of people came to Cambridge Road in North Harrow and nearly 7 tonnes of waste were collected.

It was also a chance to help boost recycling, with food waste caddies and bags handed out along with top tips from our recycling officers. Our Drop and Go trucks will be visiting a different part of the borough each month. It's our way of helping residents access services and prevent fly-tipping.

We've also doubled the number of slots for our free bulky waste collections to help out those without cars.

■ Only come when the Drop and Go truck is there – leaving items before the event could land you with a fine for fly-tipping.

We're investing £6m in our park over the next three years

Child's play: playgrounds get a makeover

Our playground makeover project is in full swing, with Canons Park and Kenton Rec the first to benefit from an upgrade.

At Canons Park, additional work included the installation of a new flood alleviation scheme to prevent water from pooling within the playground. Water is now directed to a shallow natural basin outside the play area, boosting both biodiversity and flood resilience.

And there's more to come. Pinner Memorial Park and Roxeth Recreation Ground playgrounds are next in line

for refurbishment, with temporary closures planned this summer to allow the upgrade work to take place.

New equipment, soft play areas and features, including a toddler train at Canons, are among the improvements



For the first time in a generation, we're aiming to increase the number of award-winning parks. This year, we're working towards achieving Green Flag status for Chandos Rec and Riverside Park.

Currently, we hold six Green Flags for Canons Park, Harrow Rec, Kenton Rec, Pinner Memorial Park, Roxeth Rec and Headstone Manor Park. We'll find out whether it becomes eight in July.

Keeping parks clean

We know how much you love our parks and open spaces, and we want everyone to enjoy them. That's why in the summer and when it's busier, we'll be carrying out more frequent bin collections in parks and installing larger bins in 12 of our parks to help keep them clean and tidy.

Roads to recovery

You may have already noticed improvements to our roads and pavements. We're investing £42 million over the next three years to make lasting repairs where they're most needed - matching the type of repair to each problem. Here's how it works.

How we decide which roads to repair

We carry out annual inspections and surveys to identify issues and decide what kind of repairs are needed. Some problems are bigger than others, so while we can't fix all the roads at once, we prioritise the projects that will

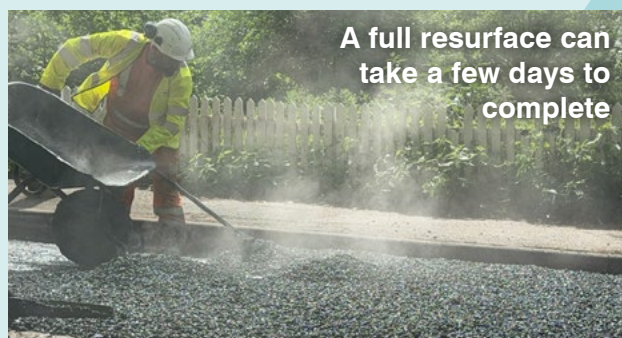
deliver the greatest long-term benefit for residents. Some roads need a full resurface; others just need patching.

This year, we are resurfacing 66 roads and 38 footways across the borough.

Full resurfacing

- Contractors mark out, strip away and remove the old, damaged surface.
- The surface is cleared of debris and prepped for repair.
- Asphalt is laid and rolled to create a smooth, even surface.
- Road markings are then repainted.

The whole process can take up to a few days, depending on the length of the road and the weather. We continue to monitor all roads after work is done.



A full resurface can take a few days to complete

Pavement repairs

If a pavement is in a bad state, we will remove the old and broken paving slabs and replace them with asphalt to provide a safe, smooth surface.

We will always let you know in advance if work is planned on your road, including what kind of repairs will be done. If we need to suspend parking, we'll give you plenty of notice.

Patching

Patching is used when the road is mostly in good condition but has small areas of damage.

- The JCB Pothole Pro machine cuts out the damaged area.
- It is then cleared, filled with asphalt, and rolled.
- Any road markings are then repainted.

The pothole squad - rapid response

When urgent repairs are needed – often on busy main roads – we send in our rapid response pothole squad.

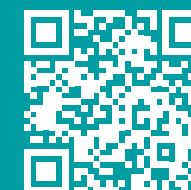
- Temporary traffic measures are put in place.
- The area is cleared, and the defect is repaired.

The heat is on

Five tips for keeping well in the summer



1 Look out for your health

We all like a little sunshine, but when the heat gets too much, we can put our health at risk without realising it. The NHS recommends staying in the shade when the sun is strongest (11am to 3pm) and drinking plenty of cold drinks to avoid the most common health risks of heat exhaustion and dehydration. 3 Pharmacy first

Bug bites and hay fever that become troubling can be treated by your pharmacist. They can also offer advice on travel vaccines for your holidays. So, think pharmacy first. And don't forget to order any regular medicines in plenty of time before you head off on holiday. For NHS advice over the phone, call 111.

4 Enjoy the outdoors safely

In hot, dry spells, it's important to be alert to fire risks, so always keep an eye on your barbecue and make sure it's extinguished properly. And, if you're enjoying our outstanding green spaces, including our six Green Flag parks, remember barbecues are not allowed.



5 Look out for each other

The over 75s, people with chronic illness and disability, and young children may struggle more with hot weather, so check on any vulnerable neighbours if you have concerns. If you're worried about someone sleeping rough, report it to thestreetlink.org.uk - they can connect people to homeless services. Keep in mind our Conversation Cafes, which operate all year round to provide support for carers and people with health issues or disabilities. 2 Stay cool

Just as we offer warm hubs for the colder months, Cedars Hub in Chicheley Road has been designated a 'Cool space'. This is somewhere people with disabilities, young children, pregnant women and older people can seek some respite from excessive heat from 1 June to 30 September.

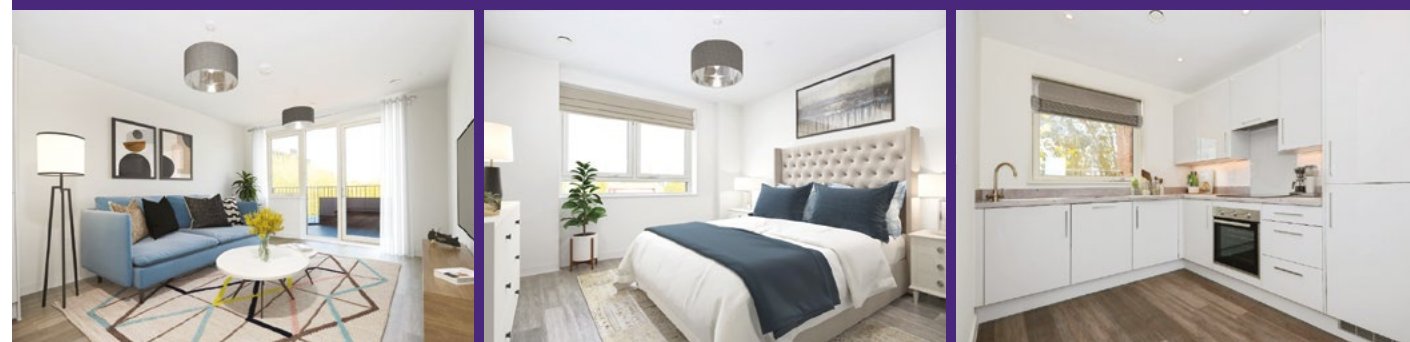

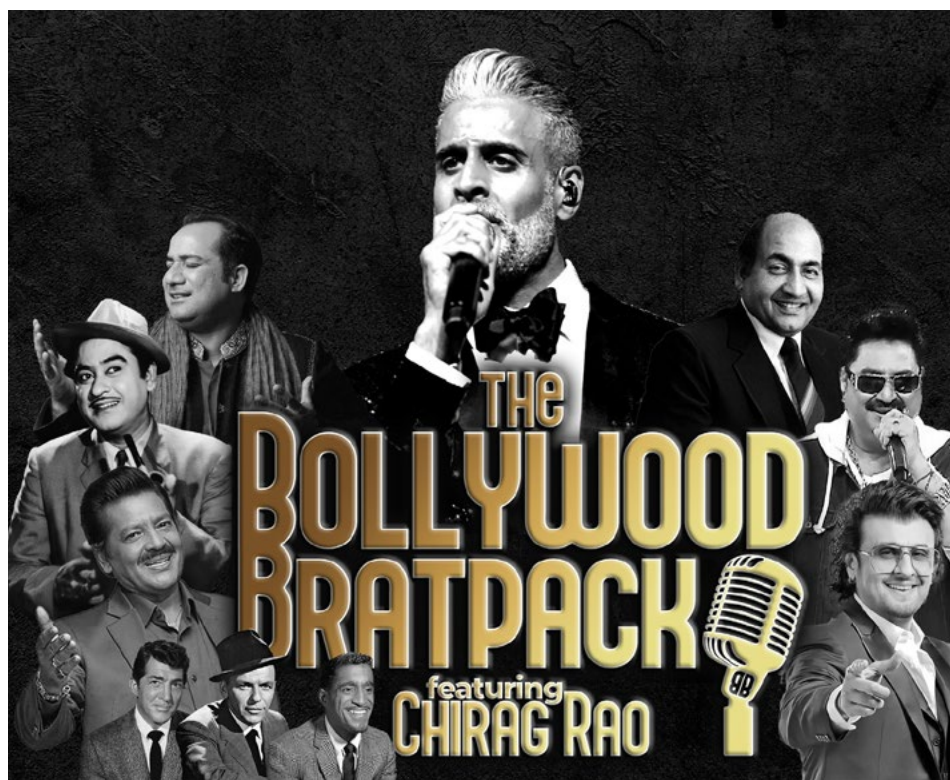
