Don't lose your right to vote by post - act now

New rules mean postal voters must reapply every three years to keep their vote active. Anyone who registered before 31 October 2023 has until 31 January 2026 to renew - after that, your right to vote by post could be lost.

Reapplying is quick and easy. Just head to www.gov.uk/apply-postal-vote and have your date of birth, National Insurance number, and signature ready.



Landlines are going digital – and Kenton is first up

The UK's big digital switchover is under way. By the end of January 2027, all old public telephone networks will be replaced with digital services. But for homes and businesses served by the Kenton Road exchange, the change is happening much sooner – before the end of November this year.

If you're unsure whether you need to upgrade, please contact your provider and they'll be able to advise you through the process.

Please be careful of any scams during this time. If you are unsure about any messages from your phone company, contact them using the number on your bill.

Stay well this winter - get the app and vaccines

You can now manage your health from your phone
– order repeat prescriptions, view records, and get
trusted NHS advice in just a few taps. You can even
request online consultations, saving time and avoiding
unnecessary trips.

With flu season here and Covid still around, free vaccines are available for over-65s, pregnant women, and those with certain health conditions. They help reduce serious illness and hospital stays.

Apply for your child's school place

If your child is due to start secondary school next year and you haven't already applied for a place, it's time to hurry.

If your child is in Year 6 you have until 31 October to submit your application for the September 2026 term.

With half-term coming up this month, it's a good idea to get your application in as soon as possible.

Clear the clutter: Drop and Go makes it easy

Our hugely popular monthly Drop and Go events bring the recycling centre to your neighbourhood – making it easier to dispose of bulky items like old furniture and appliances.

You can bring up to five items that won't fit in your household bins, and we'll take care of the rest.

We've collected more than 20 tonnes of waste at events so far and there's more to come. Our next Drop and Go is at **Pinner Wood School** on **Saturday 18 October**, from 9am to 1pm. Remember to bring proof you're a Harrow resident, just as you would at the recycling centre.

Keeping Harrow safe



ou've told us that feeling safe and tackling crime are top priorities. Across Harrow, we're stepping up efforts to make our borough cleaner, safer, and better connected.

Our Days and Nights of Action are one of the ways we're making a real difference. Since April, we've held four of these focused events, bringing together teams to tackle local issues head-on - from street safety to illegal waste dumping.

So far, our action days have made an impact in Rayners Lane, Wealdstone, Edgware, Harrow on the Hill and Stanmore, with more to come.

These events aren't just about enforcement, they're about connection. We've teamed up with local partners to share vital information on Violence Against Women and Girls, employment support, Conversation Cafés, social work services, and more.



Safe spaces for women and girls

We've launched 7 new Safe Havens in Harrow - taking our total to 21.

Our Safe Havens offer a free, confidential space for anyone feeling scared or threatened. Look for the sticker or check your nearest venue online. Trained staff are ready to help.

We're also looking for more venues to reach our target of 25 Safe Havens by March.



his year we've ramped up our road repair programme – working day and night – to deliver better, long lasting, and smoother roads. That's thanks to a £42 million investment in our 1,615 roads and pavements over the next three years.

This year we're resurfacing 66 roads and 38 pavements and we're making great progress. As you travel across the borough, you'll notice the difference.

We're also filling more potholes than ever before – more than 7,000 so far in 2025, up from 1,800 last year.

There's still a lot to do to restore pride back into our roads and we thank you for your patience while we work through the historic backlog of road repairs.

Grange Farm regeneration has been approved, bringing 45 new genuinely affordable homes, including council homes for current tenants.

Demolition began this summer, clearing the way for high-quality homes with private gardens, shared spaces, and play areas.

It's all part of a wider plan for 500 new homes and better local connections.

Construction starts in spring 2026, with residents moving in by summer 2027.

Coming soon: 36 homes at Milton Road

A major milestone has been reached at Milton Road, with the first affordable homes almost ready and set to welcome new residents soon.

The development will bring 36 much-needed homes to Harrow. 12 for council rent and 24 shared ownership properties, with priority for key workers and people with local connections.

Future residents can look forward to private gardens, balconies, landscaped green spaces, and a new commercial unit on Station Road.

This is just the start of the redevelopment at Poets Corner, set to transform the old civic centre site into a vibrant neighbourhood and provide much-needed housing for people across Harrow.

Keeping well over winter

Flu and COVID-19 can be serious

Over recent years, hospital admissions and fatalities linked to these viruses have increased—especially among certain groups.

Because these viruses change annually, natural immunity does not build up. The free flu and COVID-19 vaccinations offer the best protection.

Book your vaccines as soon as you receive your invitation.

Flu vaccine invites will go to:

- all adults aged 65 years and over
- children and people who are pregnant (If you are pregnant, the RSV and whooping cough vaccinations are also recommended. Speak to your GP or midwife about pregnancy vaccinations
- adults aged 18+ with a health condition for example: people with diabetes, breathing, heart and other health conditions and those who are immunosuppressed
- care home residents close contacts (family and carers) of immunosuppressed individuals
- frontline health and social care workers.

COVID-19 vaccine invites will go to:

- all adults aged 75 years and over
- care home residents
- anyone aged 6 months and over who are immunosuppressed.



Invites will start going out to eligible people throughout September and October.

Book through the NHS App, ask at your pharmacy or contact your GP practice. Walk-in services will also be available, scan or use the link below for more information. School aged children will be offered the flu nasal spray at school. Information and consent will be provided to parents and carers.

Harrow's £3million investment delivers results

inner resident Faisal couldn't be happier with his newly refurbished kitchen and bathroom, part of our ambitious £3 million home improvement programme.

"I love my new kitchen and bathroom. The builders have done a really great job," he said.

"Being given the option to choose the flooring, units and wall colours meant I could add my personal touch - this is what makes it feel like home.

"I can't wait to have people over again and cook in my brand-new kitchen!"

Faisal is one of hundreds of council tenants already benefitting from the programme, which is transforming homes across the borough. So far, 262 kitchens, 114 bathrooms, and 82 separate WCs have been installed - surpassing the original target of 200 upgrades.

We know there is still more to do and our housing teams are working hard every day to make homes better.

The works are part of the council's 30 Flagship Actions to restore pride in Harrow, and they're not just improving homes - they're boosting the local

economy too. Harrow-based Buildtrust Ltd was awarded the contract, ensuring the investment supports local jobs and businesses.

Each makeover is designed by experts and approved by tenants, giving residents a say in how their homes look and feel. The result? Modern, comfortable spaces that reflect the people who live in them.
