Statement of Reasons

Zebra Crossing and Double Yellow Lines:

The introduction of a zebra crossing is proposed to provide a safe and convenient point for pedestrians to cross the road, improving accessibility and reducing the risk of collisions, particularly for vulnerable users such as children, older people, and those with mobility impairments. The crossing will support walking and cycling by improving connectivity between key destinations and enhancing overall road safety.

The installation of double yellow lines is required to prevent obstructive and unsafe parking, ensure clear visibility between pedestrians and approaching drivers, and allow vehicles to approach and exit the crossing safely. This will help maintain the effectiveness of the zebra crossing and reduce the likelihood of conflicts or accidents.

Together, these measures will improve pedestrian safety, maintain traffic flow, and contribute to a safer and more accessible street environment.

Increase in Permit Holder Parking Hours:

The increase in permit holder parking hours is proposed to improve the effective management of on-street parking and better reflect current demand and usage patterns. Extending the controlled hours will help prevent commuter and long-stay parking by non-permit holders, ensuring that parking spaces remain available for residents and legitimate permit holders.

The revised hours will improve compliance, reduce displacement parking, and support access for residents, visitors, and essential services. The proposal will also contribute to improved traffic flow, reduced congestion, and safer streets by discouraging inappropriate or obstructive parking.

NOTICE OF INTENT – Highways Act 1980 (Section 23, Pedestrian Crossings) Proposed New Controlled (Zebra) Crossing at Marsh Road and proposed change of location of the Controlled (Zebra) Crossing at Station Approach, Harrow

Notice is hereby given that the London Borough of Harrow, ("the Council"), under the Highways Act 1980, intends to install a Zebra Controlled Crossing on Station Approach, Pinner, close to the junction with Marsh Road. This would upgrade the current pedestrian refuge at this location. The Council also intends to move the zebra crossing close to its north-western junction with Cecil Park westwards for 12 metres.

The introduction of a zebra crossing is proposed to provide a safe and convenient point for pedestrians to cross the road, improving accessibility and reducing the risk of collisions, particularly for vulnerable users such as children, older people, and those with mobility impairments. The crossing will support walking and cycling by improving connectivity between key destinations and enhancing overall road safety.



1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Harrow proposes to make the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and all other enabling powers.
2. The general effect of the Orders will be to:
 - a) on the east side of **Marsh Road**, to convert 35.2 metres of single yellow line (hours of control: Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm) outside Nos. 104 to 110 Marsh Road, to seven limited waiting bays (hours of control: Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm. Maximum stay 3 hours, no return within 4 hours);
 - b) the east side of **Marsh Road**, to convert 8.3 metres of single yellow line (hours of control: Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm) outside No. 112 Marsh Road, to 'at any time' waiting restrictions;
 - c) on the west side of **Marsh Road**, to convert 5.6 metres of single yellow line (hours of control: Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm) outside Nos. 139/151 Marsh Road, to one shared use parking bay (hours of control: Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm. Maximum stay 3 hours, no return within 4 hours, or Permit A holders);
 - d) the west side of **Marsh Road**, to convert one shared use parking bay (hours of control: Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm. Maximum stay 2 hours, no return within 4 hours, or Permit A holders) outside No. 143 Marsh Road, to 5.6 metres of 'at any time' waiting restrictions and build out;
 - e) on the west side of **Marsh Road**, to extend the maximum stay of the ten shared-use bays outside Nos. 145 to 171 from 2 hours to 3 hours;
 - f) on the west side of **Marsh Road**, to extend the maximum stay of the six shared-use bays outside Nos. 185 to 211 from 2 hours to 3 hours;
 - g) on the **northern junction of Marsh Road and the Chapel Lane Car Park access road**, to convert 23.4 metres of single yellow line (hours of control: Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm), to 'at any time' waiting restrictions; and
 - h) on the west side of **Marsh Road**, to convert 9.0 metres of single yellow line (hours of control: Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm) under the railway bridge, to 'at any time' waiting restrictions.

- (1) payment of the parking charge is registered electronically via the parking system. Payment is to be made on each visit; or,
- (2) a valid resident permit, business permit, trader's permit, resident visitor permit, carer's permit or Doctors permit for Zone A, or a valid health care permit.
